When does Washington Adventist Hospital close?

Emergency Department closes on Aug. 25 at 7a.m.

- Beginning at 7 a.m. on Aug. 25, EMS will transport community members who call 9-1-1 and would normally go to Washington Adventist Hospital in Takoma Park to White Oak Medical Center, or the next closest hospital

Patient Transfer Day – What to Expect

Sun., Aug 25

- All patients will be transferred from Washington Adventist Hospital to White Oak Medical Center
- Patient transfer by ambulance begins Aug. 25, approximately 8 a.m., until the last patient exits Washington Adventist Hospital, estimated around 5 p.m.
- Conducted with assistance from private ambulance company, skilled medical team accompanying patients, local EMS and police, including Takoma Park police
