INFORMATION ABOUT THIS NOTICE:

The City of Takoma Park's Safe Grow Act of 2013 restricts the use of certain pesticides for cosmetic lawn care.

As of March 1, 2014, it is illegal for commercial applicators to apply restricted pesticides for lawn care.

As of January 1, 2015, it is illegal for property owners and tenants to apply restricted pesticides for lawn care. Violations are a Class D offense.

The list of restricted pesticides can be found at www.takomaparkmd.gov/safegrow.

This notice must be posted and be visible from the public right of way closest to the area of application.

Anyone applying pesticides that are not on the restricted list for lawn care purpose must post this notice and it must remain in place two days after application. The posting requirement goes in effect for property owners and tenants on January 1, 2015, while for the commercial applicator the posting requirement goes in effect from July 1st, 2014.
