About the Cover

The Maryland Department of Transportation's (MDOT) **State Highway Administration** (SHA) began a major rehabilitation of the MD **195 (Carroll Avenue) Bridge** over Sligo Creek and Sligo Creek Parkway in fall 2015. Work includes the complete replacement of the bridge deck (driving surface), beams, columns above the arches, sidewalks, railings, and ornamental lighting. The road is slated to be reopened in July 2017.

Construction in Our Community

Lately it seems that we are surrounded by construction projects affecting local streets, from the rebuilding of the Carroll Avenue Bridge to installation of new utility poles. Here are some updates about City and State projects in our area along with contact information for the City and/or State departments involved as well as area utility companies.

Utility Work

The pace of utility work taking place in Takoma Park has increased significantly in the past several years. Much of the City's utility infrastructure dates back to the 1920s and 1950s and requires replacement. These improvements are accomplished through large, planned system replacement projects. In addition, there are new service connections and emergency work. Sidewalk Improvements

Since 2010, the City has embarked on a program to replace and repair existing sidewalks to provide safe accessible pathways and comply with Federal regulations. The City also established a process in 2012 for the community to request new sidewalks. Since then, the City has constructed more than 10,000 linear feet of new sidewalk. Current requests include the following:

- 400 & 500 blocks of Lincoln
- Kansas Lane (from Allegheny to Cockerille)
- Glenside Drive
- Maple Avenue between Sligo Creek Parkway and Maplewood Drive
- 900 block of Larch Avenue

the near future.

You may have seen dashed painted lines along a street, sidewalk or grassy area and wondered what they were for. Those are "Miss Utility" markings. Underground utility infrastructure is noted by a specific color spray-painted mark on the ground. Red represents electricity, green is for sewer, blue is for water, yellow is for natural gas, and orange is for communication lines. State law requires that Miss Utility be contacted prior to any excavation, so the underground infrastructure can be marked to avoid impact.

The Department of Public Works issues permits for non-emergency utility projects that take place within the public right of way. Utility companies are required to provide at least 48 hours advance notice to the residents that are affected by their projects. As part of the permit, the City may require a traffic control plan, tree protection measures, or street resurfacing following the project. The time frame from permit approval to the start of construction can vary greatly depending on the utility.

Also, most utility projects are done in phases – by first installing the main line and then working on individual service connects. This can make it appear as though work is being duplicated as the process doubles back. Most of the final restoration is completed by a different contractor than the one doing the initial line replacement. This adds time to the completion of a project and can also cause confusion on the part of residents who experience periods of no activity on the unfinished work. For larger projects, the City has established a Utility Work page on the City's Project Directory that provides more detailed information: takomaparkmd.gov/initiatives/project-directory/utility-work.

Takoma Park Roadway Projects

Takoma Park has approximately 42 miles of road within its City limits, 35 miles of which are owned and maintained by the City. The Public Works Department is responsible for maintenance and management of all City roadways and projects.

Carroll Avenue, Ethan Allen Avenue, New Hampshire Avenue, Philadelphia Avenue and Piney Branch Road are owned and maintained by the State Highway Administration. Sligo Creek Parkway is a Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission roadway, and its maintenance is performed by Montgomery County.

In addition to scheduled road resurfacing projects, the City has a number of large improvement projects currently in design or preparing for construction.

Ethan Allen Avenue and New Hampshire Avenue: As a key recommendation implementing the City's New Hampshire Avenue Initiative, the Ethan Allen Gateway Streetscape project will provide a safe and comfortable environment for pedestrians and bicyclists. The project will take place at the intersection of Ethan Allen Avenue/East-West Highway and New Hampshire Avenue. The project includes crosswalk improvements, bike lane addition, sidewalk improvements and bio-retention facilities to treat stormwater. Construction is expected to start in 2017. Flower Avenue Green Street: The Flower Avenue Green Street project will incorporate pedestrian safety, traffic calming and innovative stormwater management, as well as improvements to bus stops and lighting. Streetlight upgrades, new benches and refuse containers on the west side of Flower Avenue have been completed. Washington Gas began replacing the gas main in the beginning of November. The remaining work is expected to start in the summer of 2017. More information is available at floweravenue.takomaparkmd.gov.

Flower Avenue and Sligo Creek Parkway Traffic Calming: This intersection has long been a source of concern for the adjacent Longbranch Sligo neighborhood due to the speed of traffic entering the neighborhood from Sligo Creek Parkway. City Council authorized staff to develop a concept plan and request permission from Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the owners of the Parkway, to initiate an intersection redesign. An initial design concept has been developed that establishes a "T" intersection while providing treatment facilities in the existing roadway shoulder to treat surface water prior to entering Sligo Creek.

The project must go through detailed design and Park and Planning review and approval, followed by permitting. A public meeting will be held to review the design. Construction may begin in the spring or summer of 2017. WSSC recently completed sewer line relocation across Sligo Creek in this location and removed a section of the pavement during their project.

State Highway Administration Projects

Carroll Avenue Bridge Replacement Project: The Carroll Avenue bridge replacement project began this summer and is anticipated to be completed by summer 2017. The rehabilitation of the bridge includes replacing the deck, beams and columns above the arches, the sidewalks, railings, and the ornamental lights. The overall project limits extend from the intersection at Jefferson Avenue to the entrance of the Washington Adventist Hospital. In addition to rehabilitating the bridge, the project includes constructing a new sidewalk along the east side of Carroll Avenue between Old Carroll Avenue and the bridge, upgrading existing sidewalks and ramps in the work zone, and making roadway drainage improvements. Pedestrian Signal Upgrades along Carroll Avenue and Philadelphia Avenue: Pedestrian signals and curb ramps are being improved in 15 locations along Carroll and Philadelphia Avenue. These improvements will bring the pedestrian signals up to current standards. The intersections along Philadelphia Avenue where work will take place include Takoma Avenue, Piney Branch Road, Maple Avenue, and Carroll Avenue. Intersections along Carroll Avenue, Laurel Avenue, and Tulip Avenue. The Maryland State Highway Administration is overseeing the project.

City Discourages Neglect of Vacant Properties with New Ordinance

To create better awareness around vacant properties in Takoma Park, the City Council enacted Takoma Park Code Chapter

6.38 in order to formalize a process for tracking vacant properties and buildings on its legacy as a progressive city. This new vacant property ordinance will afford Takoma Park and its residents the opportunity for advanced dialogue around longstanding unoccupied properties and to plan for the creation of more sustainable neighborhoods going forward. With the City's proactive approach to the management of vacant properties, the Council intends

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that properties that have been vacant for 30 days or more be registered with the City and remit a \$200 fee unless they are furnished and have working utilities. Properties being actively

to stamp out related crime and grime before it starts. The ordinance officially went into effect July 1. It requires

sold or renovated are exempt from this process. All vacant properties must be secured and maintained satisfactorily.

DUI Multi-Jurisdictional Task Force

Community Cam Program

Members of the community who live in the City of Takoma Park can register any residential or commercial video surveillance system with the Police Department free of charge. If and when a crime occurs in an area of a registered camera system, detectives will have immediate access to the location of any registered cameras on their mobile devices. This will allow them to quickly obtain valuable video evidence to enhance apprehension capabilities. Working in partnership with the owner of the system is just one more tool in the policecommunity partnership to make Takoma Park a safe community. The registration information is confidential and can only be accessed by detectives and the police department's crime analyst. Participation is voluntary and the system owner may withdraw at any time. The registration process is a 3-step process and takes about five minutes to complete. 

Is my class canceled due to weather?



The City of Takoma Park has several ways to let you know if City facilities are closed or classes are canceled: get notices via Takoma Park Alert (**www.takomaparkmd.gov/alert**); check the City's webpage; or call the Recreation Department's Inclement Weather Line (**301-891-7101 x5605**). Be sure to check local recreation program updates, Morning and Afternoon Addition, and/or any other interersted area for updated activity information. In general, if the Federal Government closes or has a delayed opening in the morning, the City does the same. Classes that begin before a delayed opening are usually canceled. Morning and Afternoon Addition and After the Bell programs follow the Montgomery County Public Schools declarations. If there is a 2-hour delay in the morning, Morning Addition starts at 9:00 a.m.

How to apply

- 1. Pick up an application from the Takoma Park Recreation Department, Administrative Office, 7500 Maple Ave.
- 2. After you have selected an activity, complete and turn in an application before the deadline along with additional forms to a staff member at the Takoma Park Recreation Department administrative office (7500 Maple Ave.).
- 3. It may take up to 10 business days to determine if a scholarship is approved. You will be contacted by our office with an updated status.
- 4. Scholarship applications and supplemental documentation must be submitted **at least three weeks prior** to the start of the program.

Beginning with registration for winter recreation department classes on **Thursday, Dec. 15,** Takoma Park residents won't have to worry as much about spaces filling up in some of the more popular programs, such as the ones for seniors. They will register a full week earlier than non-residents, who will be eligible to register for classes on **Thursday, Dec. 22.**

"We started looking at implementing this policy about a year ago based on the popularity of our programs and classes, which increasingly are full and have waiting lists," said Takoma Park Recreation Director Gregory Clark. "There needed to be a mechanism in place so that residents would have the first opportunity to participate since we are supported by City tax dollars."

Before coming to Takoma Park ten years ago, Clark worked in Prince George's County where early or preferred registration for residents was already in place. "This practice is used in other jurisdictions in our area and around the country," he said.

Residents can take advantage of preferred registration both online and in person. Residency is based on having an address within the City limits. To confirm whether you are a City resident, visit takomaparkmd.gov/government/citycouncil/ward-map-street-directory.




