

Legal Service Review Advisory Group

Monday, November 26, 2018 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. (tentative) Takoma Park Community Center 7500 Maple Avenue, Takoma Park MD

Meeting Start Time: 6:05pm

- The meeting began with a review of the draft meeting minutes from the group's previous meeting, held on November 5, 2018. Ellen made a motion to accept the minutes, which was seconded by Anne. The minutes were unanimously approved.
- The group then debriefed from their interviews with chief administrative staff from municipalities that are similarly situated to Takoma Park regarding their knowledge and experience with municipal attorneys the types of relationships, costs, etc.
 - O Anne reported that the person with whom she spoke noted that they have a similar relationship with their City Attorney in that they are selected by and accountable to the City Council and they are contracted rather than in-house. Their attorney works on an hourly basis. For the gamut of legal needs, the municipality has spent between \$90,000-146,000 in total per year for the last five years.
 - Ellen reported that the person with whom she spoke also had a similar relationship with their City Attorney in that they are selected by and accountable to the City Council and they are contracted rather than in-house. The contract is reviewed each time a new mayor is elected. The last time the municipality put out an RFP, they got four or five responses and selected a firm that covers all of their legal needs except labor issues. In the past last five years, they have spent between \$150,000-220,000 per year on all their legal needs. The contracted firm also has associate attorneys who work on things like legal research and charge a lower hourly rate.
 - o Rizzy had not been successful in reaching the person he was supposed to interview, and will be following up with them and the group.
- The group members agreed to have the notes from the various interviews they have conducted typed up by Friday, December 7.
- They also discussed options regarding a framework for their report to Council and agreed to
 follow the City Council's mandate. The structure of the report is likely to include a section on
 methodology for information gathering, a summary of their findings, identified legal needs
 (expertise and soft skills), and recommended next steps.
