- Ellen reached out to Cindy D (council) and here is her response:

"Budget: City council is wrapping up the FY25 budget that starts this July.

"Community Events: Personally I like the idea, but I like this sort of thing. It is staff time-consuming, even if volunteers do most of the work. I am not certain about the run, as I don't know if there are any plans to revive the 5k. Assuming you mean some time after July 1 20224-June 30 2025, the best way to work this, assuming you all decide to continue this, is to work it two ways---through the Recreation Dept and through council members. The committee can outline what you are thinking of and ask the Rec Dept how much it might cost in dollars and in staff overtime (assuming it's on a weekend). Then you and the Dept would know what to ask for.

There may also be a grants opportunity in the next couple of months through the city for city-sponsored events, which would include such standards as the Folk Festival and July 4th parade. Your chances are frankly slim but it's a great way to get the word out of what you are planning. You might consult with Terry Seamans, who has been part of a group that has successfully scheduled the city's first Juneteenth celebration for this June. He might have thoughts about how best to proceed."
