## **Delay in Closing of Carroll Avenue Bridge**

The closing of the Carroll Avenue Bridge is not likely to take place until mid-July due to unfinished Verizon work. Verizon still has two to three weeks' worth of work to do, as it was apparently affected by the Verizon strike. Most of the other preparatory work related to the Carroll Avenue Bridge seems to be ready for the bridge closure.
