Context with Key Issues

In July 2016, Council created the Takoma Junction Community Process Advisory Committee by Resolution 2016-27 to help develop the process for community input for the City and Neighborhood Development Company for the Takoma Junction redevelopment project. Council appointed seven members, representing all the wards of the City.

One member, a resident of Ward 4, resigned from the committee. The committee opening was advertised in the January City Newsletter. Janet Williams, a resident of Ward 4, has submitted an application.
