- **1323** Incident Reports were recorded in the eJustice information system in 2016
 - 492 Part 1 crimes (more serious crimes)
 - 831 Part 2 crimes (all other crimes and other types of incidents that are not crime)

• Note: The Hierarchy Rule applies when one report includes both serious and lesser offenses, meaning that only the most serious crime is counted for Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) and National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) purposes.



Key Findings

- **Reduction in crime:** In 2016, we experienced an unprecedented reduction in the crime data for UCR Part 1 Crimes. The total number of crimes was at its lowest level ever. In particular, there was a **19%** reduction from 2015 and a **25%** reduction from 2014.
- **Reduction in Thefts from Auto:** The overall reduction is due mainly to a reduction in larcenies and burglaries. Thefts from auto (including thefts from auto and thefts of auto parts) has seen a 37% reduction from 2014. This is the result of follow up investigations of theft from auto crimes, closures of burglaries and the heeding of crime prevention recommendations.
- **Reduction in Burglaries:** Burglaries during 2016 were reduced by 19%. While burglaries have sporadically occurred over the past two months, the near interruption of burglary activities in the last two months of 2016 will hopefully result in a reduction for 2017.
- Substantial increase of aggravated assaults: The level of aggravated assault has increased significantly in 2016. Many of these are known suspects and victims. (Aggravated assault must include a weapon or serious injury.)




All Crimes (2014 to 2016)



In 2016, we saw a 25% reduction in all UCR Part 1 crimes from 2014 and a 19% reduction from 2015.




All Thefts



In 2016, we saw a 31% reduction in thefts from 2014 and a 27% reduction from 2015.




Thefts from Auto



In 2016, we saw a 37% reduction in thefts from auto from 2014 and a 36% reduction from 2015.




Burglary



In 2016, we saw a 19% reduction in burglaries from 2014 and also a 19% reduction from 2015.




Aggravated Assault



In 2016, we saw a 135% increase in aggravated assault from 2014 and a 73% increase from 2015.




Auto Theft



In 2016, we saw a 37% reduction in auto theft from 2014 and a 3% increase from 2015.




Robbery



In 2016, we saw a 22% reduction in robberies from 2014 and a 8% increase from 2015.






All other Crimes

- "ILLEGAL ENTRY" category refers to an entry in a location and not an immigration related classification.




Drug Related Crime






Geographical Analysis Drug Related Crimes

Criminal Investigations Section Statistics - 2016

- Cases Assigned: 194

- Cases Exceptionally Cleared: 11
- Cases Suspended: 104*
- Arrests: 38
- Closure Percentage: 45.4%

Using the data, the suspect has been linked to 42 Burglaries, 4 sightings and possibly one attempted burglary. Based on his pawn record, he will be charged this year.



Other Developments

- Accurint Crime Analysis: In 2016 we worked on the activation of the new Accurint Crime Analysis (ATAC Raids) software from Lexis Nexis. In 2017, the data coming from the eJustice system will be available online for the entire Community.
- New Reporting Structure: A new Crime Report was developed in 2016, allowing us to share information in a more efficient way with surrounding jurisdictions. The new report is sent weekly to allied agencies including MPD, MCPD and PGPD. Bulletins are issued in more urgent matters.
- **GPS Data:** In 2016 we developed new methods for GPS monitoring for crime scene correlation. We have been actively working with CSOSA (DC) and signed an MoU to have direct access to the data from DC Supervision Agency. Training is scheduled for our CID this month.
- Intelligence to other Jurisdictions: Through the cross matching of various databases, the Takoma Park Police Department was able to provide intelligence to surrounding jurisdictions that have closed numerous cases. These are the same criminals that victimize our residents.






Example of an Intelligence Report sent to Montgomery County Police Department 4th District in Wheaton and Howard County concerning suspicious pawning activities of a suspect belonging to a Group operating in Takoma Park.

The Intelligence provided led to the closing of a burglary in Howard County.



Internal Affairs Complaint Investigations

The Takoma Park Police Department's policy directives require investigations of all complaints against the Department or its employees, and that annual statistical summaries of such investigations by the internal affairs function be made available to the public. The following is a summary of complaints filed for calendar year 2016



Internal Affairs

The Takoma Park Police utilizes IAPRO which is an internal affairs case management system that tracks a variety of items to include:

- Use of force
- Departmental Collisions
- Pursuits
- Complaints
- Firearms Discharges
- PEWS (Personnel early warning system & alerts)

Complaint Investigations

- Eighteen (18) formal complaints were recorded
- Nine (9) subjected to internal affairs investigations
- Eleven (11) complaints were submitted by citizens
- Five (5) complaints were generated internally by an employee, the Chief of Police, or the Command Staff.
- Two (2) complaints were submitted by other law enforcement agencies.
- There were no complaints referred anonymously.



Targets of the Investigations

- Subjects of the complaints include a total of ten (10) sworn officers
- Some of the officers were involved in more than one complaint.
- Two (2) civilian employees were the subject of complaints
- One civilian was involved in more than one complaint.



Outcome

- Seven (7) of the eighteen (18) complaints were completed with a determination that resulted in sustained findings of improper conduct, and disciplinary measures were warranted and taken
- Three (3) complaints are still pending investigation due to case specific circumstances
- Nine (9) complaints were referred to a supervisor for investigation/counseling sessions in lieu of an internal investigation



Disciplinary Measures

- Suspensions
- Resignations
- Written reprimand
- Assignment to community service
- Assignment to other classes to address specific issues



<u>USE OF FORCE</u> <u>2016</u>

- The Takoma Park Police has strict comprehensive reporting requirements for Use of force. Reporting is required for:
- Deadly Force (includes force on animals)
- Use of a Secondary Weapon or physical strike
- Material difference in force
- Any force that results in injury or claim of injury
- Any intentional or unintentional discharge of firearm/Taser
- K-9 use
- An officer is ambushed or assaulted



USE OF FORCE 2016

Force was used during 13 incidents in 2016 which account for .05% of total police contacts (17,337 calls for service, traffic stops, self initiated calls).

- 2 of the incidents involved animals
- 1 incident involved a claim of force when no force was used.
- 1 incident involved the use of a Taser's laser light but the Taser was not deployed.
- On 5 of the 13 incidents two or more officers were involved in using force.
- 4 of the 13 incidents involved subjects with mental health issues

Special Investigations Section

The Special Investigations Section (S.I.S) is a unit comprised of three detectives and one sergeant that works under the Criminal Investigations Division. SIS investigators operate in a plain clothes capacity and are tasked with the following:

- Fugitive Apprehension
- Case Enhancement for active investigation being led by the criminal investigation section.
- Investigation of complaints originating from residents regarding quality of life issues such as narcotics violations, weapon offenses and prostitution.
- Assisting regional law enforcement allies with felony investigations which cross jurisdictional boundaries.
- Self-initiated investigations which stem from pro-active street level enforcement.



Special Investigations Section

Notable Arrests

During 2016, members of S.A.T. made many notable arrests to include the following:

- Recovery of 25 bags of crack cocaine and a loaded handgun on a traffic stop by a subject wearing body armor. An occupant of the traffic stop was wanted for attempted murder in the District of Columbia.
- Recovery of a handgun by a prohibited felon found after a narcotics complaint and service of a search warrant.
- Recovery of a handgun and an amount of controlled dangerous substance indicative of an intent to sell which was recovered pursuant to a search warrant.






Area Map






Heat Map


