Public Hearing on proposed amendment to the City Charter changing the date of City elections and associated amendments

Recommended Council Action

Hear testimony.

Context with Key Issues

The public hearing is to provide an opportunity for public comments on the proposed Charter Amendment.

If adopted, the Charter Amendment would (1) change the date of City Elections from odd numbered years to even numbered years; (2) set the term for the Mayor and City Council elected in 2017 to one year; (3) change the date of the nominating meeting to the second Tuesday after Labor Day in an election year; (4) extend the time for certification of election results; and (5) change the day on which the newly elected Mayor and Councilmembers take office.

The public hearing notice was published twice in a newspaper of general circulation as required by the City Charter and State law. There was an error in the day of the week listed in the advertisement (Monday, April 5 instead of Wednesday, April 5). As a result, the notice will be republished and a second public hearing has been scheduled for April 26. If adopted according to the new schedule, the Charter Amendment will become effective on June 29, 2017.

Council Priority

Engaged, Responsive & Service Oriented Government

Environmental Impact of Action

The change of the date of City elections is not expected to have an environmental impact.

Fiscal Impact of Action

\$15,000 is included in the proposed budget for the November 2017 Election. Staff anticipates that the November 2018 election will cost \$30,000. The suggested fiscal impact includes staffing five precincts and the Community Center on election day, additional mailings and education regarding the date change and the voting process, and additional ballots and vote by mail ballots. The Board of Elections is assuming that the ballots will be counted by hand as in 2015. The \$30,000 does not include election equipment other than electronic pollbooks.

Racial Equity Impact of Action

We believe the Charter Amendment changing the date of City elections will increase voter turnout overall, result in more residents from Wards 4, 5, and 6 participating in the election, and, as a result, increase participation by minority residents.

10 11 12 13	WHEREAS,	pursuant to the Takoma Park Charter, regular City of Takoma Park municipal elections take place the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of every odd-numbered year; and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS,	to have their names placed on the ballot, candidates for the office of Mayor or City Councilmember are nominated at a nomination meeting that is scheduled on a Tuesday evening five weeks before election day; and
18 19 20	WHEREAS,	the City Board of Elections must complete the canvas and certify results of an election within 24 hours of the closing of the polls; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS,	the newly elected Mayor and City Councilmembers take office on the second Monday following the election; and
24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS,	the City Charter includes a number of provisions to expand access to voting by extending eligibility to residents who are not citizens of the United States, residents who are 16 and 17 years old, and residents who have been convicted of a felony if they are no longer incarcerated; and
29 30	WHEREAS,	the City Charter also includes provisions to make voting in City elections more convenient, including allowing early voting and voting by mail; and
31 32 33 34 35	WHEREAS,	to ensure that eligible residents are allowed to vote, City Charter provisions allow residents to register and vote on the same day and allows for provisional voting in the event that a resident cannot cast a regular ballot; and
36 37 38	WHEREAS,	the City Council has noted the low voter turnout for City elections despite efforts to increase access and encourage participation; and
39 40	WHEREAS,	voter turnout in Takoma Park elections is lowest in Wards 4, 5 and 6; and
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS,	Wards 4, 5, and 6 are all majority minority wards while approximately 75 percent of the White population lives in Wards 1, 2, and 3; and
43 44 45 46 47	WHEREAS,	since voter turnout in all wards is greater in state and federal elections than in City elections, the City Council has considered the change of election date to encourage residents who are already voting in those elections to vote in the City election at the same time; and

2	WHEREAS,	since the Town of Ocean City, Maryland, changed its election date to coincide
3		with state and federal general elections and conducted its election co-located with
4		Worcester County at the Town's single polling site beginning in 2012, turnout for
5		its elections has increased from under 25% in 2006, 2008, and 2010, to 48, 37,
6		and 44 percent in 2012, 2014, and 2016 respectively; and

8	WHEREAS,	the City Council placed an advisory question on the ballot for the 2015 regular
9		election: "Beginning with the election in November 2018, and providing that
10		voting rights can be maintained for City residents who are (1) 16-17 years old, (2)
11 12		non-citizens, or (3) on parole or probation for a felony conviction, and that instant runoff voting and same day voter registration can be maintained, the City of
12		Takoma Park municipal elections for Mayor and Councilmembers should be

18	WHEREAS,	of the 2552 voters who turned out for the election, 16 percent opposed the date
19	,	change and 76 percent supported it; and

23		State ballot for the presidential and gubernatorial general elections beginning in
24		2018; and

26	WHEREAS,	Takoma Park's inclusive election laws and instant runoff voting cannot be
27		accommodated by the State in 2018; and

29	WHEREAS,	the City Council held a series of work sessions, three public hearings, and a public

Six (6) of these members are elected by ward and are called Councilmembers, and one (1) is elected at large and is called Mayor. Each of those elected shall reside in the City and be voters of the City, and in the case of the Councilmembers, be residents of the areas from which they are so elected consistent with the provisions of Section 304, Article III of this Charter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY 1 2 **OF TAKOMA PARK,** that the date of adoption of this Charter Amendment Resolution is ____, 2017, and the amendment of the City of Takoma Park Municipal Charter enacted by 3 4 this Resolution shall become effective on _____, 2017 (50 days after its passage), unless a proper petition for referendum shall be filed as permitted by Section 502 of the City of 5 6 Takoma Park Municipal Charter and Annotated Code of Maryland, Article 23A, Section 13.
