Discussion of Boards, Commissions, and Committees – Minimum Age for Members

## **Context with Key Issues**

Chapter 2.16 of the Takoma Park Code generally addresses membership of statutory Councilappointed boards, commissions, and committees in Article 1, General Provisions. In summary:

- Members of statutory boards, commissions, and committees are appointed by the City Council;
- Members are to be residents of the City of Takoma Park unless otherwise specified in the ordinance establishing the board, commission, or committee;
- Members appointed to fill an unexpired term shall be appointed for the remainder of the term of the member being replaced;
- A short term appointment of six months or less may be extended to include the next full term;
- A member who resigns, whose term expires, or who moves out of Takoma Park may continue to participate to complete work begun during that member's term, at the discretion of the Chair; and
- The Council may remove a member by resolution if the member becomes incapacitated or fails to reasonably perform their duties.

Qualifications or criteria to be considered for serving on boards, commissions, and committees are set out in the various ordinances establishing the bodies. These may relate to areas of interest, professional qualifications, ward diversity, residence in the City of Takoma Park, and representation of another entity or a classification (such as "landlord" or "business owner"). A requirement for appointment to the Board of Elections is being a registered voter in the City.

Membership on the Youth Council is specifically limited to young people who are, or would be, in grades 7-12. At present, there is a member of the Board of Elections who was appointed when he was 16. Not long ago, there was a high school student on the Arts and Humanities Commission.

While the City Council has a goal of improving and formalizing systems for Council-appointed committees overall, this work session has been scheduled to consider whether there should be a minimum age for appointment. Any decision or direction of Council on this issue can then be incorporated into the broader discussion to take place in 2019.

Purpose: A) Plan and conduct regular and special City elections in coordination with the City Clerk; B) Encourage voter registration in the City; C) Conduct voter education programs and prepare and distribute voter outreach materials; D) Recommend to the Council amendments to the City's elections law and regulations when it deems such amendments are necessary and will provide for the improved conduct of elections; E) Periodically review City elections procedures; F) Serve as election judges in City elections; G) Recommend additional qualified individuals to the Council for appointment as election judges during a regular or special City election; H) Perform such other duties as may be assigned to the Board of Elections by Charter, ordinances and resolutions, and by the direction of the Council.

\*Members must be registered voters of Takoma Park. The Council shall make every effort to ensure that the Board of Elections includes representatives from each Council ward.

Purpose: Document, maintain, and preserve past, present, and future memorials, commemoratives, and recognitions in the City; recommend to the City Council procedures and programs to honor and commemorate individuals, organizations and businesses that have made significant contributions to the social, cultural, historical, political, economic, or civic life of the City as a whole or to a neighborhood/local area as well as programs for individuals to honor others; implement such programs within its scope and budget; and decide on recognitions after opportunity for public review and comment.

\*At least one voting member may be nominated by each of the ward Councilmembers and at least one at-large voting member may be nominated by the Mayor. No ward shall have more than two voting members on the Commission. The 4 non-voting members include the staff liaison and representatives from the Arts and Humanities Commission, the Recreation Committee, and Historic Takoma, Inc.
