Second Reading Ordinance Reestablishing the Safe Roadways Committee as the Complete Safe Streets Committee

Recommended Council Action

Consider and vote on the ordinance at second reading. First reading was held on May 22, 2019.

Context with Key Issues

The Safe Roadways Committee lost most of its members in 2017 and 2018 due to term limits and resignations. Remaining members Frank Demarais and Michael Moore, and newly appointed member Jessica Landman, met with staff and the City Council to develop a recommendation to reestablish the committee and rename it.

The name of the Complete Safe Streets Committee is intended to reflect a focus beyond what happens on the street itself and more clearly incorporate pedestrian safety and the various means of getting from place to place in and through the City.

In addition to the change of name, the ordinance anticipates designation of a staff liaison to the Committee and adds outreach to residents as part of the Committee duties and responsibilities.

Council Priority

Engaged, Responsive and Service-Oriented Government, Environmentally Sustainable Community.

Environmental Considerations

The Committee's focus on pedestrians, bicyclists, transit, and safe and efficient streets supports the City's sustainability goals.

Fiscal Considerations

Fiscal impacts include staff support and data collection. The work of the Committee may lead to recommendations of infrastructure modifications.

Racial Equity Considerations

The work of the Committee should benefit all parts of the City and, particularly, users of transit, pedestrians, and bicyclists. The Committee should incorporate a race equity lens into its work and recommendations. Additionally, the Council seeks to recruit and attract more people of color to serve on boards, commissions and committees.

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2.16.120 Committee membership, terms of office, structure, and staffing.

A. Membership. The Committee consists of up to 11 persons to be appointed by the Council. Efforts shall be made to have representation from each of the City's wards, and to ensure diversity of interests and subject matter expertise where feasible. Members may serve for no more than six years continuously.

B. Terms of Office. Committee members shall serve staggered two-year terms with initial appointments of one and two years. All terms shall begin on July 1st and end on June 30th. Midterm vacancies shall be filled to serve the balance of the unexpired term.

C. Structure.

1. The Committee shall organize to accomplish its purposes, and elect from its members co-chairs and other officers as it shall deem necessary. Elections for officers shall be held annually.

2. The Committee shall meet at least quarterly.

3. All meetings are open to the public and are subject to the Maryland Open Meetings Act. Meeting notices and agendas are prepared and submitted to the City Clerk and posted in advance of any Committee meeting in accordance with State law. Written records of Committee proceedings are maintained. A report on the activities of the Committee shall be submitted to the Council at least once a year.

4. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum to conduct business.

D. Staffing. The City Manager <u>shall designate a Committee liaison</u>, <u>who</u> <u>or his or her designee</u> shall provide appropriate staff support to the Committee on an as needed basis, <u>when requested</u>, <u>but staff shall not be permanently assigned to the Committee</u>.

E. The Committee shall conform to other provisions of Article 1 of this chapter as may be amended from time to time.

2.16.130 Duties and responsibilities of the committee.

The Committee shall advise and assist the Council with respect to developing and implementing policies to increase transportation safety and accessibility in Takoma Park, especially for pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit riders. In furtherance of these duties, the Committee shall attempt to accomplish the following:

A. Assist the Council in the development of policies and programming that address the transportation concerns of the community.

B. Assist the Council in <u>outreach to residents to understand their Complete Streets priorities</u> <u>and concerns, and in prioritizing transportation-related projects.</u>

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92	C. Collaborate with programs and organizations and with other City task forces and		
93	committees that may, at any time, be involved in matters relating to Takoma Park roadways
