

Plan Context and Purpose


Public Land in Takoma Park

Purpose of Plan

- Provide a framework to guide future decision making processes regarding public space in the City of Takoma Park
- Clarify roles, responsibilities, and expectations in public space management
- Develop performance measures on how public space will be most effectively used, maintained, and expanded in Takoma Park
- Identify creative uses and reuses of City right-of-way which anticipates the changing needs of the community and City
- Provide a foundation to apply for grant funding and demonstrate the City's commitment to improving public space

















Draft Goals for Public Space Management Plan

Maintenance and Enhancement of Existing Resources

Connectivity and Accessibility to Public Space for All

Establish Criteria for Acquisition

Creative Reuse of Right-of-Way as Public Space



Maintenance and Enhancement of Existing Resources

- Ensure that current spaces are effectively maintained and utilized
- Foster a mix of types of public spaces for active and passive recreational opportunities as well as social gathering space
- Foster and maintain an environmentally sustainable public space network
- Inventory condition of parks and develop associated recommendations for enhancement



Connectivity and Accessibility to Public Space for All

- Ensure access and improve multi-modal connectivity to public space
- Facilitate equitable access to public space for all members of the community



Establish Criteria for Acquisition

- Prioritize multi-modal access and connectivity
- Advance social and racial equity in the distribution of public space and recreational opportunities
- Ensure a fiscally sustainable public space network
- Advance climate change resiliency
- Develop framework to evaluate future spaces rather than identify a list of spaces



Creative Reuse of Right-of-Way as Public Space

- Incorporate and program City owned rights-of-way into a holistic vision of public space
- Improve City streets as places for community building and increased access by non-vehicular modes of transportation



Project Examples for Plan Outcome

 Conversion of parking spaces or other street spaces into bicycle parking or parklet. Cost can vary, approximately \$3,000 for bike racks, bollards, paint





Project Examples

 Park Design and Creation-Approximately \$250,000 for design, grading, playground equipment





Project Examples

Green Infrastructure Projects in Right of Way

- Addition of bioretention facilities and modular wetland systems (raingardens on Glenside Drive)
- Approximately \$200,000 to 300,000 for construction
