

Takoma Park City Council Meeting – October 5, 2020 Agenda Item 2

Voting Session

Uncodified Emergency Ordinance Suspending Appointments to Boards, Commissions, and Committees Except in Circumstances in Which the Council Determines that an Appointment is Necessary to Perform the Assigned Function, is Representative of Takoma Park's Diversity, and Shortening the Terms of Such Appointments

Recommended Council Action

Consider and vote on the emergency ordinance.

Context with Key Issues

The City Council set as one of its priorities a review of the existing structure, appointment processes, and practices for Council-appointed committees to increase efficiency and effectiveness and attract new members, and to explore innovative ways to engage residents who tend to be harder to reach, with a desired outcome of enabling diverse, engaged, productive, and rewarding committee membership.

On June 3, 2020, the Council heard an update on the work of a small ad hoc committee that included a number of staff members, Mayor Stewart, and Councilmember Dyballa. The committee had put out preliminary draft recommendations that included, among other things, establishing a new process for selecting and appointing committee members.

Because these and other preliminary draft recommendations had not been shared with committees and the public for comment and feedback, and, recognizing that the review process will extend into early 2021, the committee recommended 1) that Council consider delaying appointments to fill committee vacancies unless needed to keep the committee functioning, and 2) that Council extend the terms of eligible committee members to June 30, 2021.

On July 29, 2020, the Council adopted an emergency ordinance (Ordinance 2020-25) to extend committee terms for eligible members. No final decision was made on whether to delay filling vacancies. The Council agreed to revisit the question in September.

At a work session on September 23, the City Council discussed how to approach filling vacancies on Council-appointed committees. No clear consensus was reached by the Council. The City Attorney was asked to draft several emergency ordinances to provide options for the Council at a work session on September 30.

On September 30, the Council discussed the options and requested that the City Attorney prepare a draft ordinance that enables the Council to fill positions when necessary for a board, commission or committee to perform its assigned function and/or, in the Council's own discretion, when the applicant is representative of Takoma Park's diversity. In either case, such appointments will be for terms that will expire on June 30, 2021, subject to reappointment depending upon the Council's final determination.
