Adopt the ordinances approving purchases.

Context with Key Issues

All the items listed are included in the FY 2021 budget.

Public Works Department – Replacement Pickup Truck for the Food Waste Collection Program
The current vehicle #244 used for food waste collection was purchased in 2008 and has exceeded its useful life. The Department solicited price proposals for an F-250 pickup truck as a replacement. Three responses were received as follows: Hertrich Fleet Services (\$32,289); Academy Ford (\$35,314); Chesapeake Ford (\$40,905). Because the food waste creates a very caustic substance that is hard on metal, the Department uses an add-on dump hopper that sits in the bed of the truck. A new, larger hopper is needed due to the growing popularity and added participation in our food waste collection program. Staff also recommends the addition of lifter to improve worker safety and reduce strain from lifting the food waste containers into the hopper. The hopper and lift will be purchased separately. The hopper price is \$9,716. The lift equipment is expected to be \$3,000. The total cost of all three components will exceed the allocated CIP amount of \$41,500 by approximately \$3,500. The item before Council at this time is the truck purchase only. The purchase has been reviewed and approved by the Fleet Review Committee. This is a gasoline powered vehicle; there is no equivalent all-electric vehicle at this time.

Police Department - Mobile Computers

The Department uses the Panasonic Toughbook rugged computers in vehicles used by officers. The computers are necessary for Computer Aided Dispatch, writing reports, issuing traffic citations, warnings, and equipment repair orders, preparing field interview reports, and accessing the necessary databases. The current units are aging and in need of replacement. The cost to purchase and install 12 computers is \$50,217. The price is based on a competitively bid State of Maryland contract with Front Line Mobile Tech.

Police Department – Replacement Patrol Vehicles

The Department proposes replacement of four patrol vehicles pursuant to the Vehicle Replacement/ Addition/Transfer Policy and Schedule. The replacements have been reviewed and approved by the Fleet Review Committee. The proposed purchase is for four Ford Interceptor Hybrid SUVs at the cost of \$231,956, based on a competitively bid State of Maryland contract with Apple Ford. Two of the SUVs are equipped for prisoner transport. There are no all-electric vehicles that are rated for patrol purposes.

<u>Library – Contract Renewal for Userful DiscoverStation Turnkey System</u>

The Library has operated a two-room public Computer Center with ten workstations in each room, an additional four workstations in the Senior Room, and four in the Library. The Userful DiscoverStation turnkey system has been in operation by the Library since 2005. Throughout that time, it has undergone frequent upgrades and won many awards. Although the current Library building may not reopen again, there is a continuing demand for public internet service. We plan to provide that service in an alternate location during construction of the new Library and during transition. The product has been highly customized to meet our needs and we do not wish to lose that customization by discontinuing the service. Our contract expires at the end of February. With a continuing three-year contract, we will receive new multi-station computers while keeping the older ones which can be used to replace even older units. They will also be used to access our library catalog. Staff have found the system to be user-friendly, reliable, secure and adaptable to a range of applications. With a minimum of maintenance, equipment replacement and intervention, the Library has been successful in operating the Computer Center for 51 hours per week with a single staff presence at any one time. Library staff recommends renewal with Userful Corporation, as the sole provider of a system that is unique in its cost-effectiveness and ability to meet the City's needs.

Environmental Considerations

- The Ford F-250 pickup truck is gasoline powered; there is no equivalent all-electric vehicle. The truck is to serve the food compost collection which advances City environmental goals.
- The police vehicles to be purchased are hybrids and more efficient than the existing vehicles. There are no all-electric police vehicles rated for patrol use at this time.
- The Userful system allows one host PC or server to serve multiple workstations which reduces the amount of hardware necessary for each station and lowers infrastructure and energy costs significantly, including a 60% reduction in energy costs.

Fiscal Considerations

- Ford F-250: \$32,280 (plus \$9,716 and \$3,500 for the hopper and lift)
- The contract for purchase and installation of 12 mobile computers: \$50,217
- Four equipped Ford Interceptor Hybrid SUVs: \$231,956
- Three-year contract renewal with Userful Corporation: \$24,852. The contract cost has been reduced by eliminating one multi-station computer that serves the existing Library building.

Racial Equity Considerations

The Userful library computers enable the Library to provide free public computing to anyone with a Takoma Park Library card, in more than 30 languages simultaneously, including Amharic. The vehicles will more safely serve Public Works and Police staff, a majority of whom are people of color.

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR PUBLIC COMPUTERS, SOFTWARE, AND SUPPORT FOR THE COMPUTER LEARNING CENTER, SENIOR ROOM AND LIBRARY, AND ANY ALTERNATE LOCATIONS AS NECESSARY

- WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2021 budget includes funding for computers, software, and support for the Computer Learning Center, Senior Room and Library, which can also be provided at alternate locations during Library construction; and
- WHEREAS, since 2005, the City has operated a two-room public Computer Learning Center, with ten workstations installed in each room; and
- WHEREAS, an additional four workstations are located in the Senior Room of the Computer Learning Center; and
- WHEREAS, an additional four workstations are located in the Library; and
- WHEREAS, in 2005, Userful Corporation was deemed a sole source provider of multi-station Linux turnkey computer operations; and
- WHEREAS, the designation of Userful Corporation as a sole source provider was re-affirmed by the City Council in 2008 and 2011 and 2015 and 2018; and
- WHEREAS, Library staff has found the Userful DiscoverStation turnkey system to be user-friendly, reliable, secure and adaptable to a range of public computer needs; and
- WHEREAS, the Library Director recommends that the City enter into a three-year contract with Userful Corporation for computers, software, and support for the Computer Learning Center; Senior Room, Library and/ or at other locations where necessary during Library construction; and
- WHEREAS, the City Manager has determined that Userful Corporation meets the criterion of a sole source procurement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND THAT:
