Update on Process for City Manager Search

Review process for city manager recruitment and hiring.

Context with Key Issues

City Manager Suzanne Ludlow will retire on July 1, 2021. The City Council has contracted with the Novak Consulting Group/Raftelis an executive search firm to assist the new City Council with the recruitment process for hiring a new city manager. Under city code, the city council has responsibility for this.

City Councilmembers and members of the City's staff have shared their initial views on the recruitment process in interviews with the search firm.

On February 4th from 6pm to 8pm, the Council held a Community Conversation on the City Manager Search. Members of the public joined the Council to discuss the attributes residents would like to see in the next City Manager and the most important issues facing the community today and in the near future. Tonight, we will review what was discussed on the 4th.

Council is also finalizing other ways that our community will have input into the process, which will include at the outset of the process:

- An online survey on important skills and values in our city's management is available on the City website and will be translated into Amharic, Spanish and French.
- Two stakeholder focus groups on important city management skills and values to be held in late February.

Residents also have the opportunity to provide input through written input to the entire city council through the city clerk, or during public comments at regular council meetings each Wednesday evening.
