

Potential Additional Strategies to Include in 2021-2022 Priorities:

1. Livable Community for All

- Assess the need to increase staffing or providing funds for consulting services to the Housing and Community Development Department to meet the needs of residents.
- Develop new ways to share information with and provide services to immigrant and refugee communities through improved community outreach and engagement processes, including through translation and Community Ambassadors structures.
- Festival of Lights
- Purchase of window guards
- Autonomous Trolley Service for the City
- Explore the hiring of Chief Equity Officer
- Explore the criteria to be certified as a [Welcoming Community](#) to evaluate what programs or policies the City may want to adopt.
- Additional Housing Priorities:
 - Business Incubators -- Perhaps we could have a version of this at the Junction or the Rec Center.
 - Reserve Fund Uses -- so far we're only using it in two ways (Home Stretch and the Habitat project on Garland). Are there other ways we could use the funds?
 - Abandoned Homes -- finding a way to increase fees or taxes to induce having the homes made available for actual housing of people is worth exploring.

- Allocate funds for a Ward 5 Chamber of Commerce to increase marketing and promotion of activities for those businesses.
