Context with Key Issues

The City's new Fiscal Year 2023 will begin July 1, 2022. In preparation for the City Manager's FY23 Recommended Budget Presentation on April 13, 2022 and subsequent budget work sessions, the City's Finance Director will provide a presentation on recent trends in the City's reserve levels, unassigned fund balances, and overall financial structure from a multi-year perspective to "set the stage" for upcoming budget discussions.

The presentation will touch on best practices in managing and monitoring the City's financial activities in the City's four major funds: the General Fund, the Stormwater Management Fund, the Special Revenue Funds, and the Speed Camera Fund. This is a follow up presentation to the [Presentation of the Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report \(ACFR\) and Audit](#) that occurred at the City Council meeting on November 17, 2021 by the City's auditor, CohnReznick LLP.

In addition to this presentation on the City's Fiscal Health, and the City Manager's FY23 Recommended Budget Presentation on April 13, there will be budget work sessions occurring on April 18, April 25, and May 2. A public hearing on the proposed FY23 budget will be held on April 27 during the Council as well as a public hearing on the Constant Yield Tax Rate that same evening. The First Reading of the FY23 Budget Ordinances is scheduled for Wednesday, May 11. The Second (final) Reading of the FY23 Budget Ordinances is scheduled for Wednesday, May 18.

Environmental Considerations

Effective management of the City's financial health ensures that financial resources are available to support substantial continued investment in improving the environment in Takoma Park, including, but not limited to stormwater system improvements, general sustainability efforts, continued efforts towards increasing tree canopy, and continued work on library renovations to meet the highest green standards possible.

Fiscal Considerations

The purpose of this presentation is to provide budget context and a general outlook for the City's fiscal health so that the City Council and the public might have a better understanding of the structural factors that will determine the City Manager's approach to the Fiscal Year 2023 Recommended Budget and that will impact budget decision-making in the coming weeks.

Racial Equity Considerations

The City's FY23 budget will include funds to address racial equity through COVID-19 recovery efforts, implementation of the housing and economic development strategic plan, consideration of the recommendations of the Reimagining Public Safety Task Force, construction of the Library, planning the Recreation Center project, community engagement efforts on many subjects, pedestrian and transit safety improvements, work on the Minor Master Plan, and tree canopy and other environmental improvements.
