Presentation on the FY24 Community Quality of Life Grant Award Recommendations

Recommended Council Action

Hear the presentation and adopt the thirteen Grants Review Committee FY24 Community Quality of Life Grant Award Recommendations.

Context with Key Issues

The City of Takoma Park's Community Quality of Life Grants Program provides up to \$10,000 for programs, projects, and events that improve the quality of life for City residents by providing greater access and opportunities for participation in the arts and science for predominantly low-and-moderate-income residents.

The program is administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development, overseen by the Housing Manager, and staffed by the City's Grants Coordinator. A Grants Review Committee comprised by residents appointed by the City Council, review all completed applications and develop funding recommendations annually. Funding recommendations are forwarded to the City Council following review and deliberations by the Grants Review Committee. In FY24, the City Council allocated \$110,000 for this program from ARPA funds.

Fiscal Considerations

The dollar-for-dollar match requirement of the Community Grant Program is met (and often exceeded) by every Quality of Life grantee. For this reason, the program's value to the City is much larger than the City's investment/cost.

If the GRC's FY24 funding recommendations are adopted, the City's initial investment of \$110,000 will be leveraged by grantees to concentrate an additional \$280,000 in funding and resources.

Racial Equity Considerations

In FY24, the Grants Review Committee (GRC) continued and deepened its commitment to race equity in all decision-making. For the last five years, the Committee has provided all applicants with the City's resolution committing itself to systematically and deliberately applying a race equity lens in

AUTHORIZING AWARD OF FY24 COMMUNITY QUALITY OF LIFE GRANT FUNDS

- WHEREAS, the Community Quality of Life Grants program, established by Resolution 2016-14 on June 15, 2016, provides financial support for specific programs, projects and events that improve residents' quality of life by providing greater access and opportunities for participation in the arts and sciences; and
- WHEREAS, the availability of grant funding was announced in January 2023; and
- WHEREAS, fifteen (15) applications were received and fifteen (15) eligible applications were forwarded to the Grants Review Committee for review and evaluation; and
- WHEREAS, a total of \$110,000 has been budgeted for the FY24 Community 'Quality of Life' Grants Program from ARPA funds; and
- WHEREAS, the funding recommendations of the Committee were presented to the Council for consideration on May 10, 2023; and
- WHEREAS, the Council concurs with the Committee's funding recommendations.

Proposal Decision Guideline:

- 1. Eliminate score under 85% (Tier 3), which includes 2 applications: Within U/House Of Blessing
- 2. Applicant with the score between 85% and 90% (Tier 2) is granted with \$8,200 equally.
- 3. Applicant with the score above (Tier 1) is granted with \$9,000 equally except CREATE Arts Center, which is granted with full amount of \$6,000.
- 4. Total Number of Grantees: 13 Organizations
- 5. Total Cost comes to \$110,000.
