They Called Him "Mister Lee"

Join us for a screening of *They Called Him "Mister Lee,"* a new documentary about the legendary Lee Jordan—school custodian, coach, and mentor to Takoma Park's youth, both Black and White.

Jordan organized the city's Boys and Girls Club, the first integrated sports program in Montgomery County. An advocate for the Black community, he campaigned to improve living conditions of African American residents in the face of segregation and racial discrimination. (32 minutes)

Discussion will follow with project filmmaker Michel Fincham, folklorist Ali Kahn, and participants in the film and project. The event is cosponsored by Historic Takoma Inc. and the City of Takoma Park Recreation Department.
