Youth Council members must be Takoma Park residents in grades 7-12. They serve for one year but are eligible to apply for reappointment. Members must attend meetings regularly, maintain at least a 2.5 grade point average, and set a positive example for youth in the community. Youth Council members are eligible for SSL hours OR stipends. The City Council will make appointments to the Youth Council in September. If interested, apply by Friday, August 16. Finance:

• The Finance Department is pleased to announce that the City's annual comprehensive financial report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023 has met the requirements to be awarded GFOA's Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting.

The GFOA established the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program (Certificate Program) in 1945 to encourage and assist state and local governments to go beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles to prepare annual comprehensive financial reports that evidence the spirit of transparency and full disclosure and then to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal.

The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting. Congratulations, again, for having satisfied the high standards of the program.

Housing & Community Development:

• The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development has awarded the City a Community Health and Safety Works Grant in the amount of \$92,250 under the Environmental Health and Justice Category. The funds will be used to discourage illegal dumping, activate public green space, and improve treatment of stormwater runoff in the 6500 block of Sligo Mill Road. Neighbors in the Sligo Mill area have shown their investment in the success of this project from the beginning stages. In his letter of support for the application, neighborhood resident Jeremy Schwartz said the following: This is a fixable problem, and the City of Takoma Park has developed a thoughtful and comprehensive proposal that is clearly based on community input. The proposed structural changes will significantly reduce illegal dumping and improve community health and safety. The project will improve the health of our urban forest while improving community pride and our sense of ownership of public space. Personally, this application makes me feel seen and heard, as City staff are showing that they have been listening to community input and have taken our expressed concerns about the Sligo Mill area seriously.
