On Wednesday, June 19th from noon until 6:00 pm, at the Lee Jordan Field behind the Takoma Park Middle School, 7611 Piney Branch Ave, there will be music, fellowship, food trucks, activities for children and adults, and sound by DJ Beezy. Rain dates are June 22nd or 23rd. Juneteenth is an important celebration for educating, agitating, and further acknowledgement of this culturally meaningful event, when Union soldiers forced Texas to acknowledge the Emancipation Proclamation and the slaves there finally received their freedom, more than two years after it had been implemented.
