





Main Climate Goals and Priorities:


- City of Takoma Park: Net Zero by 2035
- Montgomery County: 100% reduction of GHG emissions by 2035
- Maryland State: 50% reduction by 2030 (2006 baseline)
- MWCOG regional goal: 50% reduction by 2030 and 80% by 2050 (2005 baseline)

Environmentally Sustainable Community (Council Priorities) 2023-2024

- Climate Change Mitigation: Work towards net-zero greenhouse gas emissions goal by 2035.
- Climate Change Resilience: Improve our ability to adapt and be resilient to local impacts of climate change.
- Manage our Community's Natural Resources Sustainably: Protect, maintain, and improve the health of our urban forest, natural resources, and water quality, with an emphasis on equity.



Takoma Park's GHG Emissions Profile




2020 emissions data

Building Energy Use & Transportation are the largest source of emissions in the City

- 42% from buildings
- 48% from transportation
- 129,869 MTCO2 in 2020
 - 27,485 MTCO2 fossil fuel use in buildings
 - 26,419 MTCO2 from electricity use
 - 62,406 MTCO2 from transportation
 - 10,325 MTCO2 fugitive sources
 - 1,978 MTCO2 waste and water
 - (1,889) MTCO2 trees & forestation

GREENHOUSE GAS TRENDS CHART - TAKOMA PARK


Takoma Park greenhouse gas emissions decreased by

27% from 2005 - 2020.




Emission Reductions have decreased by 27% since 2005

New Transportation & Building Emissions Data for Montgomery County- 2022


Transportation Emissions



Yearly emissions from transportation were up 8% in 2022 from 2021 levels. The estimated inboundary emissions were 1,230,000 tCO₂e per year.



The County's total estimated residential emissions are $3,470,000 \text{ tCO}_2\text{e}$ per year, and $1,810,000 \text{ tCO}_2\text{e}$ per year for non-residential.


Our Metropolitan Region is on Track for its Goals:

Climate Emergency Response Framework Update: Buildings

- Building Energy Performance Standards (BEPS) approved by Montgomery County, regulating buildings 25,000 sq. feet and above. The Community Center has a baseline energy audit conducted
- Strong emphasis on solar education and clean energy attainment for residents (homeowners & renters)- Mar. 12 event
- New MFBIG Grant for multifamily property owners- Opened in Jan. 2024
- ACEEE proposal for BEPS for buildings 10,000 – 25,000 sq. feet- still under review

Climate Emergency Response Framework Update: Transportation


- Continued outreach and participation in curbside charging permitting for EVs
- Fleet Transition Plan all electric city fleet by 2035. Still under review.
 - No new fossil fuel-powered vehicles purchased after 2028
 - Examining funding options to pursue charge infrastructure
 - Police pursuit-rated EV vehicles may soon become available
 - Make use if new Direct Pay option from IRS, effective this year
- MCPS received nearly \$4.7 million to purchase 50 school buses through EPA's first Clean School Bus Program's Grants





Climate Emergency Response Framework Update: Multimodal Transit

- New Ave Bikeway planned for New Hampshire Ave. Overall, HCD has been successful in obtaining several MWCOG and state grants to support their Bikeways program
- Maple Ave. Connectivity Project is underway- RK&K was selected as the project consultant, and they have begun meeting with city staff to prepare the community engagement strategy since Fall 2023
- On September 14, 2023, the City was awarded a new grant from the (MDOT) Kim Lamphier Bikeways Network Program for the Metropolitan Branch Trail Upgrade; will allow the City to complete the design and then seek construction funds.
- 53 bike racks purchased in 2022; to be installed at locations in every ward and in City parks. As of 2023, about 10 have been deployed; other installations upcoming.



Climate Emergency Response Framework Update: Renewable Energy and Toward a Fossil Fuel-Free Community

- Electrify MC- Direct incentives program for the County; info sessions held, outreach at City level. Still running, # of city residents pending
- Development of comprehensive electrification education & outreach campaign (IRA calculator tool, partner for Apr. 6th event)
- Montgomery County Community Choice Energy (CCE) for 100% renewable electricity; pilot moving forward
- Montgomery County passed gas powered lawn care equipment ban; sales prohibited from July 01, 2024



Climate Emergency Response Framework Update: Natural Resources

Stormwater

- Low Impact Development Center stormwater resiliency study still underway
- My Rainplan tool on the website
- 3rd community meeting in the near future
- Takoma Branch Stream restoration completed (Poplar and NH Ave.)
- Brashier's Run outfall repair is out to bid (Maple Ave and Sligo Creek Pkwy)
- Houston Ave Filtera Project that is currently in the design phase and will be out to bid to be built before the end of FY24
- Urban Forestry Report 2023
 - Number of Trees Planted Public Space Trees Planted- 24
 - Tree Takoma Trees Planted- 279
 - Removal Permit Replacement Trees- 53
 - Takoma Park's urban forest canopy remains impressive and commendable for an inner suburban community.
 - The rate of tree loss appears to have decreased substantially.
- Environmental Restoration
 - Circle Woods invasive removal project received PEPCO grant; contracted work for invasive removal has been completed. Some planting has been done but tree planting will be in March and signage being installed
 - Stuart Armstrong project also grant funded; work has started with invasive removal
 - Continuous removal of invasive horticultural species from our designed sites



New Federal and State Funding Programs:

- Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG)- EPA's new \$5 billion program to provide grants to states, local
 governments to develop and implement ambitious plans for reducing GHG emissions. The City is planning to
 join coalition applications with Montgomery County and possibly State
- Maryland Energy Administration (MEA)- various 2024 grant opportunities. City has submitted to OPEN program to support tenant engagement for MFBIG
 - Pursuing an additional grant for solar expansion on top of new library
- Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)- New Elective Pay allowance. Allows municipalities to now claim clean-energy investment tax credits. Currently being pursued; collaboration with PW and Finance.
- Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) NEVI (National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure) funding- Round 1 open, City is not in a high-priority corridor. Will look into applying for round 2 for community charging.
 - Examining options for MF chargers with partner Avanza EV.

- Chesapeake Conservation and Climate Corps- City DPW was successfully selected as a Host Organization; pending a match with a Corps member based in out local area. Runs Aug. 2024-Aug. 2025

 - City achieved 'bronze' certification in 2020; new category of 'silver' is open; City will be applying for that. Due June 2024.

Sustainability Budget Implications:

- Support for enhancing existing programs
 - Specifically seeking support for a full time intern for FY25- would lead to enhanced capacity for community outreach
 - Support for special events funding; program returning postpandemic
- Cost Efficiencies:
 - Chesapeake Conservation Corps member placement (tentative)
 - Building on existing partner programs (ie, Electrify MC) and no-cost technical assistance (NLC, Green Bank, etc.)
- The time is now to build on the IRA's momentum:
 - Pursuing grant funds (state and federal) to support clean energy projects, vehicle replacement, and charging stations
 - Macro-level funds -→ micro-level solutions
 - Grant dollars are critical to put emissions-reducing technologies in place that will get us to our Net Zero target.
