COMMUNICATIONS:

Bid from A. C. Tenley of \$250.00 for the collection and disposal of Garbage for the Town. Referred to Health Comm.

Letter from Dr. Llewellyn Jordan and Donald M. Wallace in regard to improvement of ground around Spring in North Takoma. Referred to Civic and Street Committees.

Letter from H. P. Ware in regard assessment of his property. Referred to Finance Committee.

Application from Walter L. Burgan applying for position on Town Police Force.

Resolution from Mayor and Council of Capitol Heights protesting charges of Washington Suburban Sanitary Comm. To Finance Committee.

Proposal from Takoma Motor Co. quoting a price of \$666.27 for a new Ford truck for the hauling of garbage. To Civic and Health Committee.

Letter from Jos. M. Voelker commending Officer Frank Lane for recovery of his stolen automobile.

Annual Financial Statement of the Town of Takoma Park for the Fiscal Year ending June 30th was presented by the Town Treasurer and on motion was ordered approved.

Mr. Adams Chairman of the Finance Committee made a motion that the Annual report be published in the Takoma Journal. Motion seconded and approved.

Dr. Llewellyn Jordan addressed the Council on various matters, including the improvement of Takoma Ave.

Mr. L. R. Grabill, Sr., presented a letter to the Mayor and Council in regard to the paving of Buffalo Ave., and same was referred to the Street Committee.

Mr. C. J. Gardner of 25 Woodland Ave. entered a protest against the erection of a Municipal Building, and stated that he thought the taxpayers should be allowed to vote on same.

POLICE REPORT:

Mr. Sherburne, Chairman of the Police Committee reported that the regular routine work of the Police Department had been carried out during the month with a reduction of a number of complaints, mostly about dogs wandering at large without muzzles and tags, and recommended the appointment of Mr. Earl Seek as Dog Catcher with a commission as Special Police Officer covering the work of Dog Catcher, he to receive One Dollar for each dog impounded legally, and the owner claims the dog and pays the fine, and One Dollar for each dog legally impounded and disposed of.

Mr. Sherburne stated that he had a conference with Mr. Diamond, Commissioner of Police for Montgomery County, and Chief of Police Moxley, relative to better cooperation between the County and Town Police Forces, also relative to providing their car with a radio so that we can reach them

by Radio in case of an emergency call while the car is patrolling.

The matter of paying the salary of a desk man here for the station so the officers could spend more time on the outside in patrol duty was not favorably received by the Commissioner as he stated they had no way to pay the salary. A letter from the Commissioner outlining their position in the matter is on file in the Clerk's Office of the Town.

Committee recommended that the Council give authority to employ a relief man in special emergencies when officers are off duty sick, etc., and that they be paid at the same rate as the officers now on duty.

Relative to the letter of April 17th, 1933, addressed to the Mayor and Council from Mr. M. C. Merrill in regard to "No Parking" signs on Carroll Ave. near the fire house on Saturday nights, Mr. Sherburne stated that he had received authority from the State Roads Commissioner to erect these signs, and that same would be installed soon.

Mr. Sherburne stated that marked progress had been made during the last two weeks in clearing up cases of particular interest to the people of Takoma Park and hoped to give a complete report at the August meeting.

Mr. Sherburne stated that the Department was in need of a pair of handcuffs, and that a pair could be procured for \$4.00, and recommended the purchase of same.

It was also recommended that any officer be reimbursed for any expense incurred, such as meals and carefare, while working on any case outside of the Town.

Mr. Boyer made a motion that Mr. Earl Seek be appointed as Dog Catcher and motion was seconded and approved.

After some discussion the matter of a relief officer was tabled.

Mr. Boyer made a motion that a pair of handcuffs be purchased and same was approved.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that forms be printed to be issued to each Police Officer or Special Officer when sworn in for duty, and same was seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that any officer be reimbursed for expenses incurred in line of duty on any case which takes him out of Town. Motion seconded and approved.

FIRE AND LIGHT COMMITTEE

Mr. Conger presented a report from Chief L. B. Moffett of the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Dept. showing the activities

of the Department from Jan. 1st, 1933 to July 13th, 1933, and made a motion that the Town Council extend their thanks to the Fire Department for their very capable work. Motion seconded and approved.

A letter was read from Chief Moffett in regard to needed repairs on Streets in order that the Department may answer calls with all possible speed, and same was referred to the Street Committee.

Mr. Conger made a motion that a fire plug be installed at the corner of Phila. and Holly Aves. for the protection of the property in that vicinity. Motion seconded and approved.

STREET COMMITTEE:-

Committee reports the work of widening Carroll Ave. between Elm and Willow Aves. has been completed, and stone wall and sidewalks in that block have also been finished, and the street is now open for traffic in its entire width.

Within another week the State Road Commission will complete the widening of Carroll Ave. between the Sligo and Flower Ave.

The drainage system on Spring Ave. has also been completed and should now be ample to carry off the water even in the heaviest rain.

On motion the report of the Street Committee was approved.

Mr. Remsen, Chairman of the Street Committee, stated that the letter of Chief Moffett in regard to the condition of certain Streets would be given attention.

Mr. Remsen stated that the County Commissioners had promised to pave Takoma Ave., and that just as soon as this was completed the Town hoped to be able to Pave Buffalo Ave.


CIVIC AND HEALTH COMMITTEE:-



Mr. Adams, Chairman of the Finance Committee, stated that the resolution of the Capitol Heights officials would be investigated, and made a motion that the resolution be printed in the Takoma Journal. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Adams stated that estimates would be asked for on the annual Town audit in order that same might be gotten underway without delay.

On motion the Council adjourned at 10:00 P.M.

SPECIAL MEETING
MAYOR AND COUNCIL
AUGUST 9th, 1933.

Meeting called to order at 8:30 P.M.

Those present were Mayor Lewton, Councilmen Boyer, Conger, Remsen and Sherburne.

Mayor Lewton stated that meeting was called to further discuss the Storm Sewer on Cedar Ave., and stated that Dr. Ellicott of the County Board of Health had visited this section, and had written a letter and advised that the existing pond at Cedar and Dogwood Aves., would have to be drained and any other steps taken that are necessary to correct the condition existing there.

A petition was presented by the Mayor to the Council asking the Court to compel Mrs. Dodge to take steps necessary to abate the nuisance at this point, and Mr. Conger made a motion that the petition be filed with the Court. Motion seconded and approved.

Mayor Lewton was authorized by Council to write to Dr. Ellicott advising him of the decision and action of the Council in this matter.

Mr. Boyer made inquiry as to the Ordinance regarding the riding of vehicles on the sidewalks of the Town, and was advised that the Ordinance as at present did not carry with it Bicycles or Automobiles. Mr. Boyer made a motion that Section 5 of Article 32 be amended to include the riding of Bicycles and Automobiles on the Sidewalks. Motion seconded by Mr. Conger and approved.

Attention of the Council was called to the bad condition of the Adding Machine in the Treasurers Office, and the amount necessary to have same repaired. Mr. Conger made a motion that a new machine be purchased at a price quoted of One Hundred Dollars less Fifteen Dollars trade-in allowance on the old machine. Motion seconded and approved.

Matter of curb and gutter for Lincoln Ave. as advertised for a hearing at the May regular meeting was laid before the Council and Mr. Remsen made a motion that the Street Committee be authorized to draw up specifications for curb and gutter on Lincoln Ave., and any other streets that may be deemed necessary at this time, and that same be advertised in the established manner to receive proper bids. Motion seconded and approved.

Complaint was received from Gladys E. and Mildred Pheobus and Edith Pheobus in regard assessment of Lot 6,

Block 5, Carroll Sub-Division, and on motion same was referred to the Finance Committee for investigation.

Claim for exemption from improvement tax was made on Lot 37, Block 50, assessed in the name of Donald H. & M. E. Lewis, due to the fact that the property had burned and had not been replaced. On motion, properly seconded exemption was granted to cover the assessment of \$1400. on the improvement.

Matter of audit of the books of the Clerk and Treasurer of the Town was discussed, and motion was made that several auditing firms be asked to submit proposals on or before 7:00 P.M. Aug. 18th next. Motion approved.

At 10:00 P. M. Council adjourned.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Letter from J. B. Kinnear stating that Nov. 24th, 1933 would be the half century of progress for Takoma Park and suggesting that some steps be taken to celebrate this golden anniversary. Referred to Civic Committee.

Letter from A. D. Kiefer calling attention to the dangerous condition of Takoma Ave. between Phila. and Boston Aves. Referred to Street Committee.

Letter from R. L. Wallin of the Washington Missionary College expressing appreciation of the work done by the Town Police in running down the theft of money at the College.

Letter from Fred C. Duehring, Chairman representing property owners on Chestnut Ave. in regard to widening of Street. To Street Committee.

Letter from Wm. J. Myers of Greenwood Ave. in regard to hedge growing out over Street. To Police Committee.

Petition from 12 residents of Takoma Ave. asking that this Street be improved immediately. To Street Committee.

Invitation to Mayor and Council to participate in Mardi Gras Parade at Hagerstown, Md., on Aug. 22nd. To Civic Committee.

Petition from 7 residents of Takoma Ave. in regard to burning rubbish on vacant ground in that vicinity. to Police Committee.

Letter from Horace E. Flack in regard to application for loans for Civic Improvements, sending along with same a pamphlet showing information desired. To Finance Committee.

Mr. Johnson and Mr. Busby addressed the Council in regard Storm sewer on Cedar Ave.

Mr. F. S. Papot asked that fill be made on Cedar Ave., in order that he may have access to a new house which he is building on that street.

Mr. Pritchard addressed the Council favoring the petition of property owners for the improvement of Takoma Ave.

Mr. J. D. Draper, builder, referred to the Council matter of obtaining a building permit from Prince Georges County, and not from the Town, and was advised by the Mayor that he would have to get a Town permit.

Miss Vivian Simpson referred to the Council matter of Sub-Division of approximately one acre of land in the vicinity of Valley View Ave., belonging to Mr. Hobart, and after some discussion Miss Simpson was advised to get the matter in more definite shape as to grades, etc. for further consideration by the Council.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:-

Mr. Adams, Chariman, stated that bids had been secured from a number of certified public accountants for auditing the books of the Clerk and Treasurer for the fiscal year 1932, and recommended that the bid of Snyder, Farr & Co., in the amount of \$175.00 be accepted.

In the matter of request by the Takoma Volunteer Fire Dept. for an increase in appropriation for this year, committee recommends that the Fire Dept. be advised that no additional appropriation can be considered at this time, as each item in the Town Budget had been kept down to the minimum and conditions would not permit of an additional appropriation.

In the matter of request of Mr. H. P. Ware for reduction in assessment on his property, committee reaffirms its former decision that the assessment be not changed at this time.

On motion, properly seconded, the report of the Finance Committee was approved.

POLICE COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Sherburne, Chairman, recommended the appoint of Mr. J.H. Lawhead as Special Officer for the Washington Sanitarium, covering the grounds only. Mr. Sherburne stated that a permit had been issued Mr. A. D. Kiefer for use on his premises only, in order to rid same of rats. Committee reported the gobbery at Bliss Electrical School of last February had been nearly cleared up and fines totaling \$122.50 had been collected during the past month. The County police car has also been equipped with a radio

in order that the patrolling officer can be kept in touch with. Town Police Car has covered 11,000 miles since April, or an average of 90 miles per day. 19 calls have been answered with an average of 3 minutes per call. 15 arrests were made during the month. Committee recommends that the stop signs at Poplar and Elm. Aves. be repainted, and also recommends the purchase of rain coats for the three officers.

In regard to the letter of Mr. W. J. Myers, Mr. Sherburne stated that he would arrange with Supt. Fischer to take care of the matter complained of.

In regard to petition from residents of Takoma Ave. about rubbish being burned on property opposite their homes, Mr. Sherburne made a motion that the Town Clerk be directed to refer this petition to Mr. Lacy Shaw, as this property is under the jurisdiction of the County. Motion approved.

Mr. Sherburne also advised that the Town Clerk had commission blanks ready to be issued to Special Officers.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that Mr. J. H. Lawhead be appointed Special Officer to cover the grounds at the Washington Sanitarium. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Conger made a motion that a deposit of \$2.00 be required on each numbered badge issued to Special Officers, same to be refunded to them upon return of badge. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that Police Committee be authorized to have the two Stop Signs at Elm & Poplar Aves. repainted. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that three rain coats be purchased for the Police Dept., price not to exceed \$5.00 per coat. Motion seconded and approved.

FIRE AND LIGHT COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Conger, Chairman, advised that a fire plug had been installed at Holly and Phila. Aves. Report was read by Mr. Conger from L. B. Moffit, Chief of the Takoma Park Vol. Fire Dept. showing calls made, and the amount of investment by the Dept. in building and equipment as compared with other Departments in the County.

ORDINANCE AND JUDICIARY COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Taft, Chairman, stated that the matter of license fees for Hucksters, etc., had not been put in shape for presentation, but that same would be ready shortly.

STREET COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Remsen, Chairman, reported the resurfacing of a number of streets and repairs to numerous sidewalks.

In regard to the petitions of citizens from Chestnut and Takoma Aves. Mr. Remsen made a motion that the contents of these petitions be transmitted to the State and County Officials with letters accompanying same asking that attention be given the matters immediately. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Remsen stated that the letter of Mr. A. D. Kiefer would be held for further investigation.

Mr. Conger stated that he understood approval had been given for the clearing of Woodland Ave. down to the Prince Georges School and inquired as to when this matter would be given attention.

CIVIC COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Boyer, Chairman, stated that 2140 children had been in attendance at the playgrounds during the period it has been open and extended an invitation to the Mayor and Council to attend the Field Day exercises at the Playgrounds on Tuesday, Aug. 29th, and on motion, properly seconded, the invitation was accepted.

Mr. Boyer made a motion that \$5.00 be appropriated for Parks and Playgrounds to cover additional expenses. Motion seconded and approved.

In regard to the letter of Mr. Kinneary, Mr. Boyer made a motion that the Mayor appoint a Committee of one to get in touch with Mr. Kinneary, and that the Council go on record as favoring appropriate ceremonies covering the fiftieth anniversary of the Town of Takoma Park. Motion seconded and approved.

As to letter from the Hagerstown Fire Department asking the Mayor and Council to participate in the Mardi Gras parade on Aug. 22nd, Mr. Boyer made a motion that we communicate with them and advise that it would be impossible at this time for the Mayor and Council to attend in a body and extend wishes for success in their undertaking. Motion seconded and approved.


In reference to the bid for handling garbage, Mr. Boyer stated that the present system was so satisfactory, and in fact a little cheaper than the proposed system, and recommended no further action along that line, and as the Town replaced one truck each year, giving each truck a life of two years, Mr. Boyer made a motion that the proposal of the Takoma Motor Co., to replace the old chassis with a new one for \$666.27, plus \$10.00 for removing, repainting and replacing the old body on the new chassis, less \$156.27 trade-in value on the old garbage truck, be accepted. Motion seconded and approved.


Mr. Boyer recommended that the offer of Mr. Donald M. Wallace to place steps at the spring in North Takoma be accepted, and after some discussion it was decided that the matter be held in abeyance for the present, and until it was determined just what was needed there, and motion of Mr. Boyer was withdrawn and another motion made by Mr. Boyer that Mr. Wallace and Dr. Jordan be thanked for their interest in the matter, and advised that same would be given further consideration. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Boyer stated that the ditch on Cedar Ave. was getting in a dangerous condition and made a motion that the Town proceed to construct 100 ft. of the culvert in accordance with a former resolution. After some discussion Mr. Remsen made a motion that the matter be tabled, and after further discussion as to the dangerous condition of the ditch Mr. Remsen made a motion, seconded by Mr. Conger, that the present ditch be filled in. Mr. Boyer moved that this motion be tabled. Mayor Lewton stated that a vote would be taken on the tabling of Mr. Boyer's first motion and motion to table same was approved. Vote was then taken on motion to fill in the ditch and same was approved.

Mr. Conger made a motion that Supt? Fischer be instructed to take measures to protect the street from over-flow of water onto the street, and motion was seconded and approved.

On motion, Council adjourned at 10:20 P.M.

Those present were Mayor Lewton, Councilmen Conger, Remsen, Sherburne and Taft.


A number of property owners on Cedar Ave. were present.


Mayor Lewton stated that he had asked the property owners on Cedar Ave., to meet with the Council in an endeavor to get some plan worked out for the proposed culvert on that Street. Mr. Karl A. Loos, Corporation Counsel, and Mr. Preston C. King, Attorney, were also present. After a lengthy discussion, Mr. Remsen, Chairman of the Street Committee, made a motion that engineering plans be prepared by an engineer to be employed by the Mayor for a storm sewer beginning at the South side of Dogwood Ave., running across the property of Mrs. M. P. Dodge, entering same at the point where the stream bed originally entered that property, and crossing to the line of Cedar Ave., a point approximately 100 ft. South of the opening of the culvert crossing Cedar Ave., such sewer to be constructed across the property of Mrs. Dodge on an easement to be obtained by contract, or if necessary, by condemnation proceedings, and the balance to be constructed either in the street or within the property lines on easements to be obtained by contract or condemnation. Motion seconded by Mr. Sherburne and approved.

On motion properly seconded and approved, it was decided to begin construction of approximately 100 ft. of culvert immediately, or as soon as proper ^{engineering} information could be obtained, same to connect with the present culvert on the West side of Cedar Ave., and running South approximately 100 ft.

Mr. Remsen moved that the suit against Mrs. Dodge be withdrawn, as the purpose for which the suit was drawn had been accomplished by the recent heavy storm. Motion seconded by Mr. Sherburne and approved.

On motion Council adjourned at 10:45.
