


Letter from J. R. Magnessin regard proposed extension of Valley View Ave. To Street Committee.

Petition from residents of Valley View Ave., asking for Curb on that street. To Street Committee.

Letter from H. H. Hamilton, Pres., Washington Miss. College in regard filling station on the College property. To Civic Committee.

Letter from Mr. H. H. Coban, Asst. Treas. General Conference of Seventh Day Adventists in regard to protection of hedge and lawn at the Taxi parking stand on Carroll Ave. To Police Committee.

Letter from Mrs. T. J. Parker in regard to unhealthy condition existing due to stable maintained next to her residence. To Ordinance & Judiciary and Civic and Health Committees.

Communication from Maj. E. Brooke Lee in regard to proposed work by the State Roads Commission on Philadelphia, Chestnut and Takoma Aves.

Dr. Llewellyn Jordan addressed the Council in reference to petition to the Commissioners of the District of Columbia by residents of Eastern Ave., in regard to improvement of that Street, and asked that the Council go on record as approving this project, and motion was made by Mr. Sherburne, seconded by Mr. Adams that the Council go on record as endorsing the improvement as being desirable. Motion approved.

Dr. Wilkinson of the Washington Missionary College addressed the Council in regard to re-opening of the matter of Filling Station on the College site at Carroll and Flower Aves., and after some discussion was advised that the matter should be taken up with the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission. Mr. Wallin also addressed the Council on this matter and presented a draft of the proposed location of the Filling Station.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Adams, Chairman, advised Council that there was sufficient funds on hand to take care of the proposed Curb and Gutter on Albany, Buffalo and Lincoln Aves., and referred the

matter to the Street Committee for further action.

Mr. Adams laid before the Council report of Snyder, Farr & Co., Auditors, covering audit of the books of the Town Clerk and Treasurer, and moved that the report be received and filed. Motion approved.

Mayor Lewton advised that bond in the amount of \$24,000.00 had been secured for the Town Clerk and Treasurer, and also stated that the Town would very likely lose the \$5000.00 bond money on bond of the former Clerk and Treasurer, as the Company writing the bond was defunct.

POLICE COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Shurbarne gave a summary of the activities of the Police Dept. for the month from Aug. 15th to Sept. 15th, and made a recommendation that some action be taken to correct the unsanitary condition in the rear of stores in the vicinity of Laurel and Carroll Aves. Committee also recommended that two "Zone of Quiet" signs be placed at Elm and Woodland Aves., as Mrs. Rubottom, who lives in that vicinity, is in ill health. Committee also recommended that white lines be painted at school crossings, and reported that request had been received for a "STOP" sign at the intersection of Cedar and Tulip Aves.

Mr. Sherburne moved that "Zone of Quiet" signs be placed at Elm and Woodland Aves. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne moved that store managers in the vicinity of Laurel and Carroll Aves. be advised to correct the unsanitary condition existing there immediately or arrest would follow. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne moved that "STOP" sign be placed on Tulip Ave. at the intersection of Tulip and Cedar Aves. Motion seconded and approved.

Motion made and seconded that the Police Committee be empowered to put "Stop" and "Speed" signs wherever necessary provided same be approved by the State. Motion approved.

FIRE AND LIGHT:-

Mr. Conger, Chairman, read to Council a report from Mr. L. B. Moffitt covering activities of the Takoma Park Vol. Fire Dept. for the month.

ORDINANCE AND JUDICIARY:-

Mr. Taft, Chairman, laid before the Mayor and Council copy of the proposed Ordinance covering the licensing of Peddlers and Hucksters in Takoma Park, and asked that same be studied for definite action at an early date.

STREET COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Remsen, Chairman, reported usual routine work had been carried out and the completion of the Culvert along Cedar Ave. Mr. Remsen also reported that a walk had been completed from

from Elm. Ave. along Woodland Ave., which would benefit the children going to the Prince Georges County School.

Mr. Remsen stated that after going over the several proposals for the construction of Curb and Gutter on Lincoln, Albany and Buffalo Aves., committee recommends that contract be awarded to Mr. H. H. Hershberger, and presented the following Ordinance:-

ORDINANCE NO. 238 531J

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF TAKOMA PARK, MD.

Section 1. That the bid of Mr. H. H. Hershberger for the construction of approximately 1600 ft. of Curb and Gutter on Lincoln Ave. between Carroll and Jackson Aves., and approximately 2600 ft. of Curb and Gutter on Albark and Buffalo Aves., at the intersection of these streets, of Fifty-four (54¢) Cents per lineal ft. be and the same is hereby accepted. p. 178

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into contract with the said H. H. Hershberger for and in behalf of the Town of Takoma Park, Md., for the work herein contemplated and at the price quoted.

On motion properly seconded the ordinance was approved by an aye and nay vote, Mayor Lewton, Councilmen Adams, Conger, Remsen, Sherburne and Taft voting Aye, voting Nay, None.

Mayor Lewton stated that his attention had been called to the bad condition of Lincoln Ave., and also that the sidewalk on Buffalo Ave. had been broken by the contractor hauling dirt onto the Glickman lot below the intersection and ordered that these matters be looked into and corrected.

Mayor Lewton stated that a meeting had been held to consider plans for the half century celebration of the Town of Takoma Park, and that another meeting would be held by the Committee on Saturday, Sept. 23rd, to further consider the matter and make definite plans for the celebration to begin on Nov. 24th, 1933.

On motion the Council adjourned at 10:05 P.M.

Meeting called for the purpose of discussing removal of the Town Clerk and Treasurer's office to offices better adapted for the use of the Town and for the convenience of those desiring to transact business with the Town. The matter of removal of the Town Police quarters to a more private location was also taken up.

After discussing the matters at some length Mr. Conger made a motion that the Town Clerk and Treasurer Office be moved to offices to be rented in the Citizens Building, Inc. Motion seconded by Mr. Sherburne and approved, Mr. Remsen not voting.

Mr. Conger also moved that the Police Committee, subject to the approval of the Mayor, be authorized to rent suitable quarters as soon as possible that can be used for Police quarters, and vacate those now occupied. Motion seconded by Mr. Sherburne and approved.





COMMUNICATIONS:-

Petition from 39 residents of Woodland, Elm and Beech Aves. protesting the placing of "Quiet Zone" signs in that section. Referred to Police Dept.

Letter from Leo. A. Rover, United States Attorney, expressing his gratitude for the assistance rendered his office by Sgt. Earl Thomas in a recent investigation.

Letter from Reid A. Gibbs requesting permission to construct a sidewalk, at his expense, from the Corner of Cockerille Ave. to First St. To Street Committee.

Letter from Olive E. Rubottom thanking the Mayor and Council for their assistance in helping to eliminate the noise made by children playing around her premises.

Petition from 8 residents of Manor Circle complaining of a Dog Kennel at 17 Manor Circle. To Police Committee.

Mr. Harry Dodge addressed the Council in regard to the completion of the storm sewer on Cedar Ave. Mayor Lewton advised Mr. Dodge that the Council had voted to put a sewer under Dogwood Ave. in the bed of the stream, and also to negotiate with Mrs. Dodge for the continuation of that sewer to connect with the present sewer. Mr. Dodge stated that they were willing to give an easement along the line of the present ditch.

Dr. Llewellyn Jordan spoke in regard to the broken sidewalk on Buffalo Ave., and also in regard the improvement of Takoma and Eastern Aves.

Mr. Martin L. Simpson addressed the Council in regard automobile parking in the vicinity of his property at 6 Denwood Ave., and also in regard to a sawmill that was in operation in the vicinity of his property. Mayor Lewton advised Mr. Simpson that the matters would be referred to the proper committees for attention.

Mr. I. W. Johnson of 305 Cedar Ave., addressed the Council regarding the bad condition existing on Cedar Ave., and asked that this Street be given some attention.

Mr. Walter C. Scheller of 504 Carroll Ave., called attention of the Council to the bad condition of the Street at Maple and Sherman Aves., and also to automobile speeding on Carroll Ave.

FIRE AND LIGHT COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Conger, Chairman, read a report of the activities of the Fire Department from Chief L. B. Moffitt. Letter was also read from Mr. H. C. Heffner, President of the Fire Dept., asking the Mayor and Council for approval of their efforts to secure a \$5000.00 loan from the U. S. Public Works Fund, to be used for improvements of the Building of the Department. The Council unanimously voted to give their endorsement to the project.

POLICE COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Sherburne, Chairman, gave a summary of the work carried on by the Police Dept. during the past month. Mr. Sherburne made a motion that six additional men be appointed as Special Officers for Halloween Night, three with cars and three without. Those with cars to be paid \$3.00 for the hours from six P. M. to midnight, and those without cars \$2.00 for the same hours. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that the Taxi Stand on Carroll Ave. be done away with and a new Taxi Stand be authorized for six cars at right angles to the curb to be located at the corner of Eastern and Laurel Aves., and that the Taxi Companies now using the present stand be notified that their permit to occupy same is hereby revoked and that the Town no longer sanctions its use. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Sherburne advised that "STOP" signs had been placed at Tulip and Cedar Aves.

STREET COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Remsen, Chairman reported general street work carried out through the month, and also stated that the contract for the curb and gutter had progressed to the point where the work on Buffalo and Albany Aves. would be completed that week, and that the contractor would then move to Lincoln Ave. to install curb and gutter as authorized under his contract. Mr. Remsen stated that in connection with the work in North Takoma a 16 degree radius was established on three corners of the intersection. This radius was adopted because of the acute angles caused by the lines of the streets at that point. A pole carrying both telephone and light wires on the S. W. corner, next to the Lake Lot prevents the curb and gutter being laid to the 13 degree radius. This would be most desirable, and as there may be some expense in removing this pole, Street Committee refers this matter to the Lights Committee for investigation, and recommends to Council that the curb be built to the new radius, and will proceed with the same to complete the contract unless Council decides otherwise.

Mr. Remsen states that weekly ash collection would start this week and that ashes should be put in proper containers and accessible to the town forces. Committee also reports the entire walk to the Prince Georges County School completed. A new drainage system has been constructed at the intersection of Albany and Buffalo Ave. to carry the water directly past the intersection, thereby relieving the present drainage system on Buffalo Ave. opposite the Park. This was built by Town forces without causing any delay to the contractor.

In regard to the request of Mr. Reid Gills for laying sidewalk along Cockerille Ave., Committee recommends that he be permitted to lay the sidewalk under the Town Supervision to the best grade possible to obtain at this time, with the understanding that if at any time it is necessary to change the level that the sidewalk will be taken up and replaced at the proper level at his expense. Upon motion properly seconded the report and recommendations of the Committee were approved.

CIVIC COMMITTEE:-

Mr. Boyer, Chairman, made a report of work done on Parks, cleaning of Spring and the placing of new gravel in same.


Committee made an extensive report on the activities of the Playgrounds during the Summer season ending Sept. 30th.



MAYOR AND COUNCIL
OCT. 25th, 1933.

Meeting called to order at 8:00 P.M.
Those present were Mayor Lewton, Councilmen Adams, Boyer, Conger and Sherburne.

Mayor Lewton stated that he had called the meeting to consider several matters, one being a letter which he had received from the Montgomery County Health Officer, Dr. Ellicott, in regard to the Cedar Ave. culvert.

The letter of Dr. Ellicott in regard to the Culvert was discussed by the Mayor and Council at length, and on motion properly seconded it was moved to refer the letter to Corporation Counsel for advice on same from a legal standpoint. Motion approved.

Mayor Lewton stated that he had conferred with Mr. F. S. Papot and Mr. C. A. Nelson in regard to the sewer down Cedar Ave. in front of their property, and advised that these parties had agreed to give easements over their land for the

sewer and were also willing to bear a portion of the expense of the construction of the sewer. Under this agreement, Mayor Lewton stated Mr. Papot advised him he would purchase from the owner the remaining vacant lots along the east side of Cedar Ave. now owned by Mr. Wilson Petty. Mr. Boyer moved that the Town obtain easements over these four lots and proceed to construct the culvert and charge same against the lots. Motion seconded by Mr. Sherburne and approved.

Mayor Lewton stated that Justice of the Peace Mr. A. L. Wilson had taken the matter of increase in salary up with him, and after discussion of same by the Council motion was made and properly seconded that Mr. Wilson's salary as Justice of the Peace be increased from \$25.00 per month to \$50.00 per month, and in consideration of the increase Mr. Wilson was to furnish his office space at his own expense. Motion approved.

On Motion properly seconded the Mayor was authorized to purchase a used table and additional chairs for use of the Mayor and Council at special meetings. Motion approved.

Mayor Lewton referred to Council a letter from Mr. Horace Flack, Executive of Records, asking for a financial statement of the Town, and other information pertaining to taxes, etc., and on motion of Mr. Boyer, properly seconded and approved, the Town Treasurer was instructed to furnish Mr. Flack with the information requested.

On motion of Mr. Sherburne, properly seconded and approved, the Clerk was instructed to write letters to the Taxi Companies using the Taxi Stand on Carroll Ave., that the Council had revoked their permit to the stand on Carroll Ave., due to the fact that it was a State Highway and that the Town did not have the power to grant a permit for a Taxi Stand on that Street.

Mr. Sherburne made a motion that the amount of space allotted at a previous meeting for the Taxi Stand on Laurel at Eastern Ave., be reduced to space for the parking of three cabs only, and if the Taxi Companies do not avail themselves of this space within two weeks time that the permit be revoked for this Stand in order that the space might not be idle. Motion seconded and approved.

The Clerk read a letter from Mr. H. L. Thornton in regard to the large amount of space allotted for the Taxi Stand on Laurel Ave. in front of his property. Mr. Sherburne moved that a reply be sent to Mr. Thornton stating that after consideration the Council had approved a motion to reduce the Taxi Stand space to three cars. Motion seconded and approved.

Mayor Lewton stated that he had received a communication from Mr. Blassingham of the Community League asking that the Mayor and Council give their endorsement to the

resolution of the Community League that no license for the sale of intoxicating liquors in Takoma Park, Md., be granted except after a vote of the qualified voters of the Town of Takoma Park, Md., authorizing such sale. Mr. Boyer moved that the resolution as adopted by the Community League be given the endorsement of the Mayor and Council. Motion seconded and approved.

Mr. Boyer moved that Membership in the Montgomery County Civic League be continued for the coming year, and that check for \$15.00 be sent covering dues. Motion seconded and approved.

Mayor Lewton advised the Council that suit had been entered against the Town by Mrs. Louise Webb, 267 Ethan Allen Ave. for damages, due to injuries sustained in a fall on sidewalk, and that Corporation Counsel had advised that the Town send a Physician to examine Mrs. Webb. Mr. Boyer made a motion that a Physician be sent to examine Mrs. Webb, and accepted Mr. Sherburne's amendment to the motion that a reputable bone specialist be selected by the Mayor for the examination. Motion seconded and approved.

Answer to a letter from Mr. Bond Smith in regard to underground wires on Eastern Ave., was presented by Mr. Conger, and upon motion same was approved and ordered sent to Mr. Smith.

On motion Council adjourned at 11:00 P.M.
