Communication was received from six property owners in the vicinity of Elm, Ash and Allegheny Avenue, asking that a portion of Elm Ave. be made a "No Parking" Zone. Referred to Municipal Service Committee.

At this time Mayor Adams stated that this evening had been set aside for a hearing on the laying of Sidewalks on Holly Ave. from the end of the present concrete pavement to Phila. Ave.

Mr. F. S. Papot appeared in favor of this proposed improvement, and asked that the matter of construction of curb and gutter for this street be considered at the same time.

A letter of protest was received from Mrs. Margaret Petty Dodge in connection with this project, insofar as it concerned Lot 24 in Block 6.

Mayor Adams stated that the evening had been set aside also as a hearing on the changing of the name of Maple Ave., to some other name where a point where it intersects with Erie Ave., and running thence to Flower Ave. This matter was discussed at length from a legal standpoint, and was referred by the Mayor to the Civic Improvement and Education Committee for further study and report.

Mr. Jas. Thurman of Sligo Ave. addressed the Council regarding the acquiring a strip of land in the rear of properties facing on Sligo Ave., and stated that the property owners had an opportunity to procure a strip of land for \$500.00 from Mr. Seek, which would permit them to get into the rear of their properties from Flower Ave. Mr. Thurman desired to know from the Council if the Town would accept the dedication and maintenance of such a strip of land if purchased by them. Mayor Adams stated that he would refer the matter to the Municipal Works Committee for study and report.

Mr. Frank S. Harris addressed the Council with reference to the communication regarding the "No Parking" on a portion of Elm Ave.

Mrs. Homer C. Clouse addressed the Council regarding the triangular strip of land owned by the Town on Allegheny Ave., facing a property which she just acquired, and stated that a loan which she was trying to make upon the property would not be approved until written consent was given by the Town to the effect that she would have a right of way to and from her property at all times over this land. The Mayor referred the matter to the Clerk with instructions to report his findings to the Chairman of the Law and Ordinance Committee.

Dr. Llewellyn Jordan addressed the Council regarding the all night parking of automobiles in the Town without lights, and also regarding the New Hampshire Avenue paving project.

Mayor Adams gave the Council a brief report on an Organization, which had just been formed consisting of the Mayors of the various Municipalities in Anne Arundel, St. Marys, Calvert, Charles, Prince George's and Montgomery Counties, for the purpose of getting beneficial legislation through the General Assembly, and advised that one of the main subjects being considered at this time was the procuring for the Municipalities of a portion of the $1\frac{1}{2}\%$ lateral roads gas tax.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:- Mr. Conger, Chairman, presented bills for payment in amount of \$1402.82, and payment was approved.

MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE:- Mr. Axtell, Chairman, reported the grading of Jackson and Birch Avenues as nearing completion, and the placing of new street signs on thirty intersections.

Mr. Axtell reported three carloads of slag placed on Holly, Maple, Heather and Hancock Avenues, and that other streets would receive the same treatment at the earliest possible date. Mr. Axtell stated that it was out of the question to procure cinters at this time, as there were none available.

Regarding the 20' alley running from Maple and Erie Ave., which was reported in a very bad condition at last meeting, Mr. Axtell stated that a portion of this had been taken care of but that there was a portion over which Mr. John Ford had placed dirt from the excavation of his new home, and that nothing could be done with that section until Mr. Ford removed the dirt which he had placed there, and the Clerk was directed to so inform Mr. Ford.

Regarding the P.W.A. loan matter for street construction, Mr. Axtell stated that he had looked into this matter to some extent and found that these loans were made on an outright 45% grant, the other 55% to be obtained from the Town, preferably from other than Government sources. He stated he had found, or was informed, that over 5000 projects have been approved so far as plans are concerned, but that no allotments have been made on them, and that no allotments are being made at the present time, and that new applications were not being encouraged. Mr. Axtell stated, however, that the necessary application forms were being obtained, in order that the matter may be given further consideration.

In connection with the sidewalk on Holly Avenue, as advertised, Mr. Axtell offered the following Ordinance:--

ORDINANCE 601

BE IT OBTAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

11:190
Section 1. That the Municipal Works Committee be authorized to proceed immediately, or as soon as possible, in accordance with the provisions of the Town Charter, to construct cement concrete sidewalks on the Southeast side of Holly Avenue, as advertised in Ordinance No. 600, passed and approved December 21st, 1936, or so much of this as deemed advisable at this time, and that the Superintendent of Public Works be authorized to proceed with this work, and to employ any additional help necessary in the construction of this work.

Section 2. That assurance is made that the sidewalk be laid to proper grade, and that the cost of the work be held to a sum not to exceed One Thousand Dollars.

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Section 3. That the cost of the construction of this sidewalk be assessed in the regular manner against the property owners abutting this improvement.

Mr. Conger moved the adoption of this Ordinance, and upon being seconded by Mr. Waters, same was adopted by a Yea and Nay Vote. Voting Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen, Axtell, Conger, Duehring, Orcutt, Taft and Waters. Voting Nay - None.

CIVIC IMPROVEMENT AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE:- Mr. H. W. Orcutt, Chairman, reporting on two petitions received for the planting of trees in the parkings on Hodges Lane, stated that it seemed from the petitions that the majority of the residents desired the Flowering Cherry trees, and that in view of these facts that a permit be granted to the respective owners on both sides of Hodges Lane to plant in the parking area flowering Japanese Cherry Trees, providing that such planting be under the supervision of the Supt. of Public Works with a proper regard for the location of said trees so as not to interfere with the public travel nor with the safe and convenient ingress and egress with the respective driveways on Hodges Lane. Mr. Taft moved the approval of the recommendation, and upon being seconded by Mr. Duehring, same was approved.

With reference to the re-zoning application of J. W. Grant and E. C. Blue, for the re-zoning of a portion of Blocks 53 and 54 Gilberts Sub-Division, from Residential "A" zone to Residential "B" zone, Committee recommended that the Mayor and Council recommend to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission that the said application be approved, and that a copy of the report, together with the action of the Mayor and Council thereon, be transmitted to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Comm. (Copy of report in Civic Improvement and Education Committee file) Mr. Conger moved the adoption and approval of the report and recommendation. Motion seconded by Mr. Taft and approved.

Regarding the petition of Theo. Raines, for the re-zoning of a portion of Block 54, Gilberts Sub-Division, from Residential "A" zone to Residential "B" zone, Committee, after holding a hearing on the matter, recommended that the Mayor and Council recommend to the Maryland National Park and Planning Commission that the said applicatiob be approved, and that a copy of their report, together with the action of the Mayor and Council thereon, be transmitted to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission. (Copy of report in Civic Improvement and Education Committee file). Mr. Conger moved the adoption of the report and the recommendation therein. Motion seconded by Mr. Taft and approved.

MUNICIPAL SERVICE COMMITTEE:- Mr. Duehring Chairman, stated that his Committee, after proper investigation, was of the unanimous opinion that Allegheny Avenue, from First to Second Streets, should be made a "No Parking" area on both sides of the street, and so moved. Motion seconded by Mr. Orcutt and approved.

Mr. Duehring presented bids from the Walsh Motor Company, Hohensee Motor Co., Takoma Motion Co., and the Wolfe Motor Co. on the furnishing of a New Police Car, and these bids were referred jointly to the Municipal Service and Finance Committee for consideration.

Mr. F. G. Taylor addressed the Council regarding the unsanitary condition in the rear of the stores at the Cor. of Carroll and Lee Aves., and the Mayor asked the Chairman of the Public Welfare and

Health Committee to look into this matter.

There being no further business to come before the Council,
Council adjourned at 10:15 P. M.

COMMUNICATIONS:-

Letter from the Community League of Takoma Park endorsing an increase of \$10.00 per month for each Town Police Officer was referred to the Finance Committee.

Letter from the Community League of Takoma Park, asking the Town Council to assist in the securing of proper dedication of a portion of Boyd Avenue was referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

Letter from G. P. Bergmann protesting the "No Parking" on both of sides of Allegheny Avenue, between First and Second Streets, was referred to the joint Committees of Municipal Service and Civic Improvement and Education.

Petition from 48 residents, 34 of which were taxpayers, on Allegheny Avenue, protesting against the "No Parking" regulation on Allegheny Avenue, between First and Second Streets, was referred jointly to the Municipal Service and Civic Improvement and Education Committees.

Letter from Corporation Counsel, D. D. Lamond, along with copy of letter from H. R. O'Conner, Attorney General of the State of Maryland, regarding exemption from taxation of property at 312 Ethan Allen Avenue, used as a parsonage by the Wallace Memorial United Presbyterian Church (Located in the District of Columbia). Referred to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

Request from Jno. E. Ford that he be allowed to construct sidewalk in front of his property located at 604 Erie Avenue, construction to be done at his own expense, and under the supervision of the Town Supt. of Public Works. Referred to Municipal Works Committee.

Letter from Dr. Llewellyn Jordan in regard to the old Iris beg in the parking in front of the Peacock residence on Baltimore Avenue, was referred to the Civic Improvement and Education Committee:

Letter from the Public Service Commission to Mr. D. D. Lamond, Corporation Counsel, regarding the licensing by the Town of the Taxi-Cabs operating in the Town was referred to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

Mr. F. S. Harris and Mr. I. T. Feldman addressed the Council regarding the undedicated portion of Boyd Avenue, and asked the cooperation of the Town in securing proper dedication of this street.

Mr. J. S. Keeler, O. M. Murphy, G. P. Bergmann, Mr. Adair and Mr. Butler, all residents of Allegheny Avenue, addressed the Council regarding the petition protesting the regulation of "No Parking" on Allegheny Avenue. Mayor Adams advised this group that the matter would be referred back to the Municipal Service and Civic Improvement and Education Committees for further consideration.

Dr. Llewellyn Jordan addressed the Council regarding the dedication of various streets in the Town to the State Roads Commission, and also regarding the New Hampshire Avenue paving project through Takoma Park. Dr. Jordan also spoke in regard to the securing of voting machines in Montgomery County, and asked Council to pass a resolution regarding same.

Mr. H. C. Heffner addressed Council, and invited the Council and all other citizens of the Town to a meeting to be held in the Fire Department Bldg., on March 1st, 1937, at which meeting Mr. Jas. H. Pugh, States Attorney for Montgomery County, would be the

speaker of the evening. Mr. Heffner also spoke in favor of Civil Service examinations for the Police in the Town, and asked that this matter be taken under consideration.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:-- Mr. Conger, Chairman, presented bills in amount of \$2585.68, for approval, and same were approved and ordered paid.

Mr. Conger presented the following Ordinance:--

ORDINANCE NO. 602

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

11:17
Section 1. That the assessment submitted by the Town Clerk and Treasurer covering the grading of Birch Avenue, authorized under provisions of Ordinance No. 597, passed and approved Oct. 19th, 1936, said assessment being fixed at 85¢ per linear ft., be and the same is hereby approved.

Section 2. The assessment herein approved shall be due and payable within ninety days from this date, provided, however, that if so desired said assessment may be paid in five equal annual installments, the first due and payable within ninety days of the date thereon, and each subsequent annual payment due and payable likewise in each succeeding year until paid, provided further that payment in any amount may be made between the said annual payments if so desired. Interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum will be charged on deferred payments, said interest beginning thirty days from this date.

Mr. Conger moved the adoption of this Ordinance, and upon being seconded by Mr. Axtell, same was adopted on a Yea and Nay vote. Voting Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Axtell, Conger, Taft and Waters. Voting Nay - none.

Mr. Conger, moved that payment for the full month of December, 1936, of the salary of Deceased Justice of the Peace, Jewell J. Adams, be made to Mrs. Jewell J. Adams. Motion seconded by Mr. Axtell and approved.

MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE:-- Mr. Axtell, Chairman, reported regular, ash, trash, and garbage collection carried out through the month, and stating that the grading of Birch Avenue had been completed, and that same would be scraped and put in passable condition as soon as weather permitted.

In connection with the request of Mr. Jno. E. Ford, Mr. Axtell moved that Mr. Ford be granted permission to lay the sidewalk in front of his property on Erie Avenue, that same be put in to proper grade, and at the expense of Mr. Ford, and under the Supervision of the Supt. of Public Works of the Town. Motion seconded by Mr. Conger and approved.

CIVIC IMPROVEMENT AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE:- Mr. Taft, Vice Chairman, reported in the absence of Chairman Orcutt, that a hearing had been held on the application of Geo. B. Williams, for the re-zoning of lots 32 to 38 inclusive, in Block 19, B.F. Gilberts Sub-Division, and that at the hearing, held Feb. 13th, 1937. fourteen persons spoke in favor of re-zoning from Residential "A" to Commercial "D", and no one appeared in opposition to said application, and in view of these facts Committee recommended to the Mayor and Council that recommendatiob be made to the County Commissioners, sitting as a District Council, and to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission, that the said applicatiob be approved, and that a copy of their report, showing the action of the Mayor and Council thereon, be transmitted to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission and to the County Commissioners of Montgomery County. Mb. Taft moved the adoption of the report, and approval of the recommenda-tion therein. Mr. Axtel seconded the motion and same was ap-proved.

MUNICIPAL SERVICE COMMITTEE:- Mr. Axtel, Vice Chairman, report-ing dur to the illness of Mr. Duehring, Chairman, stated that the Committee held a meeting in reference to the bids on the purchase of a new police car, but had no definite recommenda-tion to make. The matter was discussed at length, and Mr. Conger, Chairman of the Finance Committee, moved that the matter be laid on the table until such time as proper regulations had been adopted for the conduct of the Police Department, and the care of the Police Car and other equipment. Motion seconded by Mr. Waters and approved.

Mayor Adams requested the Municipal Service Committee to get to work on these police regulations immediately in order that they may be adopted and put in force.

LAW AND ORDINANCE COMMITTEE:-- Mr. Taft, Chairman, presented the following Ordinance:--

ORDINANCE NO. 603

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

Section 1. That the re-subdivision of lots 2, 3 and 4, Block 67, Takoma Park Loan and Trust Company Sub-Division of Takoma Park, Maryland, into lots 69 to 74, both inclusive, as presented by the Eckington Investment Corporation, be and the same is hereby approved.

Mr. Taft moved the adoption of this Ordinance, and upon being seconded by Mr. Waters, same was adopted by a Yea and Nay vote. Voting Yea, The Mayor, Councilmen Axtell, Conger, Taft and Waters, Voting Nay - None.

Mr. Taft also presented the following Ordinance:--

ORDINANCE NO. 604

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

Section 1. That the re-subdivision of lots 6,7,14,15 and 16, Block 96, Section 1 of Hodges Heights, into lots 17 to 23, both inclusive, and the sub-division of a portion of acreage in Block 99, Hodges Heights, into lot 5, facing on Holly Avenue, as presented by Louise Hodges Judd and Dean W. Judd, be and the same is hereby approved.

Mr. Taft moved the adoption of this Ordinance, and upon being seconded by Mr. Conger, same was adopted by a Yea and Nay vote. Voting Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Axtell, Conger, Taft and Waters. Voting Nay - none.

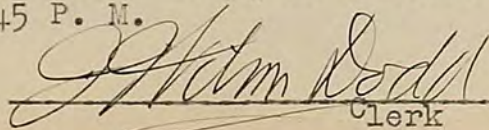
SOCIAL WELFARE AND HEALTH COMMITTEE:- Mr. Waters, Chairman, reported that the unsanitary condition in the rear of store at Carroll and Lee Avenues had been investigated and given attention. Also that the drain from the Glickman Service Station at Carroll and Tulip Avenue had been investigated, and arrangements made to take care of this matter at an early date.

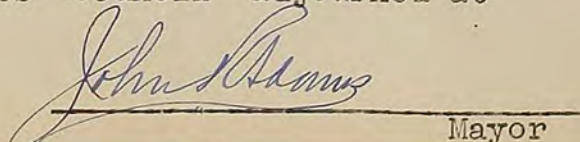
Mr. Waters stated that the Fire Department would like to dispose of the old pumper which is not being used by the Department, but that same was purchased originally in the name of the Town, and that the Department did not desire to do anything toward the disposal of this pumper without the sanction of the Town. Mayor Adams referred the matter to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

Mayor Adams stated that a Municipal League was being formed in Montgomery County comprised only of officials of incorporated towns, and that the real organization meeting would be held on Friday next, Jan, 22nd. Mayor Adams asked if there was any objection of Council to the Mayor and any members of the Council attending this meeting, and becoming members of same. Mr. Conger moved that the Mayor and such members of Council who so desired, be authorized to attend the meeting for the purpose of forming a Municipal League of Montgomery County. Motion seconded by Mr. Taft and approved.

Corporation Counsel, D. D. Lamond, addressed the Council and suggested that at this time it might be proper for the Town to consider enlarging its corporate limits, due to the fact that in the Flower Avenue section a number of dwellings had been constructed, and that a number of the people not now in the Corporate limits of the Town had expressed a desire to be taken into the Town in order that they may receive the benefits of tax-payers in the Town. This matter was taken under consideration.

There being no further business Council adjourned at 9:45 P. M.
