Mr. Orcutt moved that the Mayor extend to the proper Committee of the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Department an invitation to meet with the Mayor and Council on Tuesday evening, June 6th, 1939, to discuss with the Mayor and Council the proposed appropriation for the coming year for Fire Protection. Motion seconded by Mr. Taft and approved.

Matter of public hearing on the Town budget was discussed at length, during which discussion the fact that at the previous budget hearing no taxpayer appeared to discuss same, and the sentiment of the majority of the Council being to discontinue these hearings, Mr. Taft introduced the following Ordinance, and moved its adoption:--

ORDINANCE NO. 684

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 587, pertaining to Public Hearing on the Town Budget, be and the same is hereby repealed.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--



Mr. Conger moved that the Supt. of Public Works be instructed to make an additional trash collection each month during the period from June 15th, 1939 to Sept. 15th, 1939. Motion seconded by Mr. Orcutt and approved.

Mr. Conger presented proposed Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1st, 1939, and same was discussed item by item, after which Mr. Conger presented the following Ordinance and moved its adoption:--

MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE:

Mr. Axtell, Chairman, stated that the communication from Mr. Louis D. Bliss, regarding the condition of Chicago Avenue would be given attention at once.

The matter of Paving Program for the summer was discussed at length, after which, Mr. Axtell offered the following Ordinance and moved its adoption:-

ORDINANCE NO. 688

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:-

Section 1. In accordance with the provisions of Article 965 of the Town Charter, the Mayor and Council have under consideration the construction of cement concrete paving of the following streets, at an estimated cost of \$12.00 per linear foot. The cost of said improvement to be assessed one-third each against each abutting property owner, and the remaining one-third to be paid by the Town. *1-15-16*

1. Takoma Avenue - From Philadelphia Avenue to the Corporation line abutting Lots 1, 17, Block 67, Lots 14, 16, 17, 18, Block 68, Lots 8, 9, Block 71, Lots 11, 12, 13, 14, Block, 72, T. P. L. & T. Subdivision.

2. Greenwood Avenue - From Carroll Avenue to Corporation line abutting Lots 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, Block 105, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, Block 106, Palmer Subdivision.

3. Holly Avenue - From the end of the present concrete paving to Philadelphia Avenue, abutting Lots 4, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, Block 83, Barclay Subdivision, Lots 24, 35, 36, Block 6, Gilberts Subdivision, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, Block 84, Petty Subdivision.

4. Erie Avenue - From the end of the present concrete paving to Maple Avenue, abutting Lots 16, 31, 32, Block 52, Lots 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, Block 53, Gilberts Subdivision.

5. Valley View Avenue - From end of present concrete paving to Willow Avenue abutting Lots 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, Hobarts Subdivision.

6. Baltimore Avenue - From Philadelphia Avenue to New York Avenue, abutting Lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 24, 25, Block 80-A, T. P. L. & T. Subdivision, Lot 24, Block 100, Wayne Subdivision, Lots 1, 3, 4, Block 72-B, T. P. L. & T. Subdivision.

Section 2. The Mayor and Council at their next regular meeting, July 17, 1939, in the Fire Department Building corner of Carroll and Denwood Avenues, convening at eight o'clock p. m., will hear all persons desiring to be heard with respect to the construction herein proposed.

The adoption of the Ordinance was seconded by Mr. Conger and upon a yea and nay vote, same was adopted. Voting "yea", Mayor Adams, Councilmen Axtel, Conger, Huck, Orcutt and Taft. Voting "Nay", none.

Mr. Axtell also offered the following Ordinance and moved its adoption:-

ORDINANCE 687

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:-

Section 1. In accordance with the provisions of Article 965 of the Town Charter, the Mayor and Council have under consideration the construction of Cement Curb and Gutter in the following streets, at an approximate cost of \$1.15 per linear foot. The cost of the said improvement to be assessed against the abutting property owners.

3. Manor Circle - Entire area, abutting Lots 1 to 35 inclusive, and Lots 43 to 46 inclusive, Block 45, Carroll Manor Subdivision.

4. Davis Avenue - From Flower Avenue to Garland Avenue, abutting Lots 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, Block A. Lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, Block B, Lots 1, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, Block C, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, Block D, Cunningham Subdivision.

5. Central Avenue - Carroll Avenue to Davis Avenue, abutting Lots 8, 9, Block A, Lots 1, 22, Block B, Cunningham Subdivision.

6. Domer Avenue - From Flower Avenue to Sligo, abutting Lots 1, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, Block 58, Lot 5 and unsubdivided portion of Block 57, Gilberts Subdivision.

7. Wabash Avenue - From Flower Avenue to Sligo, abutting Lots 19, 20, 21, and unsubdivided portion, Block 57, Gilberts Subdivision.

8. Albemarle Avenue - From Kennebec Avenue to Erie Avenue abutting Lots 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, Block 53, Gilberts Subdivision.

9. Hancock Avenue - From Sherman Avenue to Sheridan Avenue, abutting Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, Block 8, Carroll Subdivision and Lots 1, 7, 8, 9, Block 7, Carroll Subdivision

10. Cockerille Avenue - From Spring Avenue to First Street, abutting Lots 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, Block 16, Pinecrest Subdivision, and Lots 1, 11, Block 10, Gibbs & Kossack Subdivision.

11. Sheridan Avenue - From Hancock Avenue to end of present Sheridan Avenue dedication, abutting Lots 5, 7, 12, Block 8, and all of Block 10 abutting Sheridan Avenue, Carroll Subdivision.

Section 2. The Mayor and Council at their next regular meeting, July 17, 1939, in the Fire Department Building, corner of Carroll and Denwood Avenues, convening at eight o'clock P. M., will hear all persons desiring to be heard with respect to the construction herein proposed.

The adoption of this Ordinance was seconded by Mr. Taft, and upon a yea and nay vote, same was adopted. Voting "Yea", Mayor Adams, Councilmen Axtell, Conger, Huck, Orcutt and Taft. Voting "Nay", none.

CIVIC IMPROVEMENT AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE:

Mr. Orcutt addressed the Council that Miss Eleanor Sherbourne who had previously been appointed Assistant Playground Supervisor, was unable to serve in this capacity due to the fact that she had received another position. Mr. Orcutt stated that he had applications from Mrs. Alberta H. Eickhorn at 624 Carroll Avenue and Miss Bessie L. Arnold of 631 Elm Avenue and stated that these applications had been gone over by the Committee and recommended the appointment of Bessie L. Arnold. Councilman Orcutt moved that Bessie L. Arnold be appointed as Assistant Playground Supervisor to cover the summer Playground period.

Mr. Orcutt stated that he had a letter from Mr. Walter C. Bladen requesting the use of the Ball Field at the Town playground on Philadelphia Avenue for each Sunday afternoon during the summer. Mr. Orcutt stated that the Committee did not feel as though it was within their right to grant the exclusive use of this Ball Field for the entire summer, due to the fact that it was a public playground. After discussion of this matter, it was moved, seconded and approved that applications for permission to use the Ball Field on Saturday and Sunday afternoons be made to the Town Clerk, who would issue the permit, no permit to be issued for more than two Saturdays or Sundays in advance, and that in issuing these permits it was to be inserted in same that licensee shall be responsible for the conduct of the assembly on the field and shall see to it that no nuisance is committed either upon the grounds of to the neighbors.

Mr. Orcutt read a letter to the Council from the Cycle Trades of America, Incorporated, regarding 1939 Safety Posters, in which they advise that they would be glad to furnish these Posters, without charge, in order that same may be displayed upon Playgrounds and in other public places. The Clerk was instructed to order a supply of these Posters for use in the Town.

MUNICIPAL SERVICE COMMITTEE:

Regarding the application of the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Department for permit to hold a Carnival in Takoma Park, Maryland, from July 31, 1939 to August 5, 1939 inclusive, after discussion of this matter, Mr. Axtell moved that the Fire Department be permitted to hold a Carnival from July 31, to August 5, 1939, inclusive, same to be held in strict accordance with the Police Regulations for the Town of Takoma Park and close each evening by not later than 11:00 o'clock, P. M., with the exception of Saturday evening, on which evening same can be continued until 12:00 o'clock, midnight. Motion seconded by Mr. Conger and approved.

On motion of Mr. Axtell, seconded by Mr. Conger, the Independence Day Celebration Committee was granted permits to hold a parade and display of Fire Works on July 4, 1939, parade to be held over the same route as last year.


With reference to the request of citizens in Valley View Avenue for "SLOW" signs to be placed at each entrance of this street in order that the high rate of speed of automobiles going through this street might be cut down, Mr. Axtell moved that a "SLOW" sign be placed at the Maple Avenue entrance into Valley View Avenue and also a "SLOW" sign Willow Avenue entrance into Valley View Avenue; that a "STOP" sign be placed on the Northeast side of Ethan Allen Avenue where it intersects Carroll Avenue; also that a "STOP" sign be placed on the Northwest corner of Carroll Avenue where it intersects Flower Avenue, the purpose of this sign being to stop traffic coming into Flower Avenue from Carroll Avenue; and that a "STOP" sign be placed on the Northeast corner of Flower Avenue to stop traffic coming into Carroll Avenue. This motion was seconded by Mr. Orcutt and approved.

WELFARE & HEALTH COMMITTEE:



The matter of complaint against the chicken house maintained by Mr. Harry Dodge on Birch Avenue, was discussed at length and it was the consensus of opinion that the Ordinance covering the maintaining of a chicken house in the Town should be enforced by the Mayor and Police. The matter of action in connection with the out house at Saratoga and Ridge Avenues was deferred until a later date.

Mr. Huck advised the Council that the Welfare Center was now comfortably installed in the Municipal Building on Columbia Avenue.

On motion, the Council adjourned at 9:35 P. M.

Regarding petition complaining of the dump in the rear of the Elementary School on Philadelphia Avenue, after discussion of this matter, Mr. Orcutt moved that the subject matter of the communication signed by the residents living in Hodges Lane, be referred to the Health Committee, with request that the Committee take up with the Superintendent of Public Works the matter of procuring a dump at another location and upon procuring such a dump, that steps be taken to cover the old dump and discontinue the use of same. Motion seconded by Mr. Duhering, and approved.

With reference to the letter from R. P. Frye, regarding increase in compensation as Building Inspector, Mr. Taft, reporting for the Finance Committee, stated that the Committee recommended that no change be made this year in the compensation of the Building Inspector due to the fact that the budget has already been adopted and passed for the coming fiscal year and that it would be out of place to give consideration at this time to his request. Mr. Taft moved the adoptions of the report and upon being seconded by Mr. Orcutt, same was adopted.

In connection with the appointment of Police Officers, Mr. Duhering moved the re-appointment of Mr. Charles O. Seek as Town Police Officer for the ensuing year at the same salary as received by other police Officers, same being an increase of \$10.00 per year over the salary Mr. Seek had been receiving during the present fiscal year. Motion was seconded by Mr. Orcutt and approved.

Mr. Duhering moved the re-appointment of Mr. Earl Thomas as Town Police Officer, and motion was seconded by Mr. Axtell. Mr. Orcutt then moved that a roll call vote be taken on the motion of re-appointment of Mr. Earl Thomas and upon being seconded by Mr. Taft, roll call was approved. Mayor Adams stated at this time that in voting on this re-appointment those in favor of the re-appointment would signify by an "aye" vote and those not in favor would signify by a "no" vote. When calling the roll, Mr. Axtell voted "aye", Mr. Duhering voted "aye", Mr. Orcutt voted "no", Mr. Taft voted "no".

The vote being a tie vote, Mayor Adams was called to give his vote and Mayor Adams voted "no". The motion, therefore, being disapproved.

Mr. Duhering then moved the re-appointment of Mr. Al Thomas as Police Office for the Town for the insuing year and this motion died for the want of the second.

On motion properly seconded, it was ordered that taxi cab licenses and drivers permits be issued to the following:- Arnold C. Wolfe, for three cabs, title numbers, B 633526, B 6651885, B 593120; James William Hall, one cab, P - 6 - 160051; James A. Flair, one cab, B 625408; Robert I. Cruitt, two cabs, B 242580, B 625647-F. The application of Mr. Arnold C. Wolfe covering fourth cab, B 568004, upon motion, properly seconded, was disapproved, with the understanding that this particular cab could be used by Mr. Wolfe provided one of the other cabs approved for him was dropped. Upon motion, properly seconded, and approved, taxi cab driver permits were issued to the following:- John Mark Kubrock, driver for Robert I. Cruitt; Stewart T. Burger, driver for A. C. Wolfe; John G. Payden, driver for A. C. Wolfe; John B. Carson, driver for A. C. Wolfe; Gregory Pigg, driver for J. W. Hall. Upon motion, properly seconded, the applications of Raymond R. Hiner and Lee Asper McCary, for driver permits, were disapproved. Mr. Orcutt moved that all future applications for taxi cab licenses and driver permits must be properly filled out and sworn to before the Committee will give consideration to same. Motion, seconded by Mr. Taft, approved. Mr. Orcutt at this time stated that the Committee, in going over the applications came to the conclusion that the Council should go on record and notify Mr. Arnold C. Wolfe that complaint had been made to the Council of his refusal to carry in his cab, certain residents in the Town, and that if further complaints were received in connection with his service, prompt action would be taken and the Council will be compelled to revoke his licenses.

Upon motion, properly seconded, the Council adjourned at 11:00 P. M.

Those present were Mayor Adams, Councilmen Axtell, Conger, Duhering, Orcutt and Taft.




