



Report of the Police activities for the past month was presented by Mayor Youngblood, which report showed total arrests of 28, total convictions 24 and total calls and complaints answered 124.

Meeting called to order at eight o'clock P. M.

Mayor Youngblood administered the Oath of Office to the newly elected Councilman, ^{and} at the same time administered to each Councilman oath giving them Special Police Powers for the Town of Takoma Park, Maryland.

The next order of business was the discussion of Tax Rate for the coming Fiscal Year and to discuss and adopt a Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1st, 1942. Amounts necessary to carry on the various departments of the Town for the coming year were thoroughly discussed by all present, and a unanimous agreement reached; after which Councilman Carr, Chairman of the Finance Committee, offered the following Ordinance to adopt Tax Rate for the coming Fiscal Year, and moved its adoption:--

ORDINANCE NO. 789

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:--

Section 1. That a General Tax Rate of Seventy-eight cents (78¢) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation, be and the same is hereby levied and approved for the purpose of meeting any and all general and special expenses for the Town for the fiscal year beginning July 1st, 1942.

Councilman Taft seconded the adoption of this Ordinance, and on a Yea and Nay vote, same was adopted. Voting Yea, Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen Carr, Heffner, Martin, Russell, Sidell and Taft. Voting Nay, none.

Councilman Taft offered the following Ordinance with reference to the Budget, and moved the adoption of same:--

ORIDNANCE NO 790

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

Section 1. That in accordance with the provisions of Section 961 of the Town Charter, the following budget is hereby approved and adopted for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1st, 1942:

On motion of Councilman Taft, properly seconded, Council adjourned at 10:45 P. M.

COMMUNICATIONS: From H. E. Preston, requesting the installation of curb and gutter abutting Lot 5 in Block 6 of Wildwood Subdivision, bordering Glengary Avenue. Referred to Municipal Works Committee.

From Roy P. Frye making application for reappointment as Bldg. Inspector for the Town of Takoma Park, Maryland, for the ensuing year. Referred to the Municipal Service Committee.

From Lydon Briscoe, Clerk to the Prince George's County Commissioners, regarding hearing in connection with the hauling of garbage into Prince George's County. Referred to the Health and Welfare Committee.

From Emma B. Woldrof, Attorney at Law, regarding injury of Mrs. Anne Potter of 501 Elm Avenue, due to a fall on March 1st, 1942 on sidewalk in Woodland Avenue near #52 Woodland Avenue. Referred to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

Petition from owners of Lots 3 in Block 9, Lot 1 in Block 3, Lots 2, 3 and 4 in Block 4, New Hampshire Avenue Highlands Subdivision, adjoining Glenside Drive and Haverford Road, requesting the construction of curb and gutter abutting their lots. Referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

From the Corresponding Secretary of the Parent-Teachers Assn. of the Philadelphia Avenue Elementary School, expressing appreciation to the Mayor and Council for their cooperation in plans for the operation of summer playgrounds for the children of this area. Referred to the Civic Improvement and Education Committee.

From M. E. Fagerstrom requesting payment of \$11.85 for damage to his automobile, same having been damaged while parking adjacent to a catch basin on Willow Avenue. Referred to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

From Maryland League of Municipalities regarding membership in the League for the coming year, accompanied by application for membership and dues schedule, the annual membership dues for the Town of Takoma Park being set at \$190.00. Referred to the Law and Ordinance Committee.

From Mr. Frank S. Harris requesting the use of the Columbia Ave. Town property and it's facilities, for the purpose of holding Inter-denominational Vesper Services, services to be held Sunday Evening from seven to eight P.M., starting June 28th, 1942 and ending Sept. 13, 1942. Referred to Civic Improvement and Education Committee.

From D. D. Lamond, Corporation Counsel, giving his opinion in connection with an Ordinance covering the keeping of chickens within the corporate limits of the Town of Takoma Park, Maryland. Referred to the Civic Improvement and Education Committee.

From the Takoma Park Christian Church, asking a reduction in the assessment against the Church property for sidewalk laid abutting it's property on Chicago Avenue. Referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

At this time Mayor Youngblood offered the following Proclamation regarding "The Scrap Rubber Drive" in the Town of Takoma Park from June 16th to the 30th inclusive:

"WHEREAS, the nation's armed forces are in immediate need of rubber for ships, tanks, airplanes, and other vital armaments, and

WHEREAS, our normal supply of rubber has been seriously impaired, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has asked the nation's help in gathering a huge stockpile of old scrap rubber to further the war efforts and insure the success of our arms.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Oliver W. Youngblood, Mayor of Takoma Park, do hereby set aside the period of June 16th to June 30th to be devoted to the TAKOMA PARK SCRAP RUBBER DRIVE, and do hereby urge every patriotic citizen to go at once through his home and place of business, to gather therefrom every available scrap of old rubber, and to take all such rubber immediately to the gasoline filling station in his neighborhood.

GIVEN under my hand and seal, this fifteenth day of June, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-two."

On a vote this Proclamation was unanimously endorsed by the Council.

At this time Ordinance No. 788 was read regarding the hearing for the paving of Columbia Avenue from Sycamore Avenue to Poplar Avenue, and Mayor Youngblood stated that at this time the hearing would be held, and requested those present who were interested to address the Council in connection with same. The only party speaking in connection with the paving was Mr. William B. Mauger, who talked at some length in stating the condition of this street, and calling to the attention of the Council the bad condition of this street for the past number of years, and Mr. Mauger heartily favored the paving of same, and prevailed upon the Council to do this work at the earliest possible moment.

The Clerk read a letter from the Kass Realty Co., owners of property abutting this proposed improvement, in which the Kass Realty Co. opposed the construction of this paving. No one else being present to participate in this discussion, the Mayor closed the hearing and referred the matter to the Municipal Works Committee.

Mr. Frank S. Harris addressed the Council in connection with the

request for the use of the Town property on Columbus Avenue for Vesper Services. Mr. Howard M. Stackhouse also spoke in connection with the use of this property, and prevailed upon the Council to approve this request.

Mr. Howard M. Stackhouse also called attention to the garage in the rear of his property belonging to Mr. E. S. LeGrow, on Carroll Ave. located on Lot 27 in Block 19, Gilbert Subdivision, and advised Council that he understood that Mr. LeGrow was converting the second story of the garage in the rear of his property into an apartment, and requested the Council to look into this matter, and, if possible, to stop Mr. LeGrow from converting same. This matter was referred to the Municipal Service Committee for investigation.

A representative from a Wholesale Life Insurance Co. (did not give is name) appeared before Council with an insurance proposition whereby the Town in some manner would insure it's inhabitants, and after listening to this gentleman for sometime, it was moved and seconded that he confer with the Corporation Counsel.

Mr. J. W. Coffman, Sr. called attention to the Mayor and Council of a newspaper item in the Washington Post regarding the meeting with the Parent-Teachers Assn. in connection with the activities of the Town Playgrounds for the summer season, and stated that he would like to be enlightened by Councilman Martin, Chairman of the Civic Improvement and Education Committee, as to the proper facts in the matter.

Councilman Martin stated that the meeting had been held with the Parent-Teachers Assn, in connection with the playgrounds, and it was understood that the Town would appropriate the usual amount of playground activities for the coming fiscal year, and that the amount appropriated by the Town was to be dispersed in the regular manner to the Supervisors appointed by the Town, and that any other money collected in the way of tuition for special activities was to be handled entirely

by the Parent-Teachers Assn., and that the Town would not participate in any manner in the expending of any of this money so collected. It was also understood that any children from the Town not paying a fee would be entitled to participate in any way of the ordinary playground activities.

Councilman Martin stated that he had expected to receive from the Parent-Teachers Assn. this evening names of the Supervisors which they recommended for appointment, but that this had not been presented to him, and the appointments would have to be held over until a later meeting.

Councilman Taft, also a member of the Civic Improvement and Education Committee, stated that the matter was presented by Councilman Martin were the facts that he received from the meeting, and that they made it very clear at this meeting that the Town would manage and operate the playgrounds as in the past.

The matter of appointments were brought up at this time, and Councilman Sidell moved that J. Wilson Dodd be reappointed Clerk and Treasurer for the Town for the ensuing year at the same salary as in the past year. This motion was seconded by Councilman Heffner and Taft, and same was approved.

Mayor Youngblood presented the names of C. E. Thomas, Charles Seek, George Altman and Byron Souders for reappointment as Police Officers for the Town of Takoma Park for the ensuing year, and on motion of Councilman Sidell, seconded by Councilmen Heffner and Taft, these officers were reappointed Town Police Officers for the ensuing year.

Mayor Youngblood at this time stated that unless there was some objection, other appointments would be deferred until a later special meeting.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Bills in amount of \$2047.84 were presented by the Finance Committee for payment, and payment of same was approved.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE: Regarding the request of the Laymens Interdenominational Committee of Takoma Park, Maryland, for the use of the Town property at 8 Columbia Avenue, to hold Vester Services, beginning with Sunday, June 28th, 1942 and ending Sunday, Sept. 13, 1942. The Committee recommended the approval of this request, and upon motion of Councilman Heffner, seconded by Councilman Martin, approval of the use of the grounds as above was given.

The matter of a water cooler for the building at 8 Columbia Avenue was brought up for discussion, after which Councilman Heffner moved that we purchase an electrically operated water cooler, to be placed in the Town Building at 8 Columbia Avenue, if such a cooler is available at this time. This motion was seconded by Councilman Martin and approved.

MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE: Councilman Russell, Chairman, reported that since the last meeting considerable progress has been made by the street forces. Curb and Gutter has been laid on both sides of Birch Avenue, between Cedar and Dogwood Avenues, and on the one side of Birch Avenue between Dogwood and Philadelphia Avenues. Also curb and gutter has been completed on both sides of Boyd Avenue from the existing concrete pavement to Jackson Avenue. Also both of these streets have been graveled.

Councilman Russell also reported sidewalks and curbs are being repaired where possible.

Regarding the hearing in connection with paving of Columbia Avenue from Sycamore Avenue to Poplar Avenue, Councilman Russell stated that his committee recommended that this paving be done, and proposed the following Ordinance, and moved its adoption:

ORDINANCE NO. 790 $\frac{1}{2}$

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

Section 1. That under authority granted by Section 965 of the Town Charter, the Mayor and Council, after due advertising and hearing, as provided therein, are of the opinion that public health, safety and comfort require the improvement of Columbia Avenue, as advertised in Ordinance

No. 788, adopted by the Mayor and Council May 11th, 1942, and that the improvement of said street is hereby authorized in such manner as the Mayor and Council may deem within the terms of said Ordinance.

Section 2. Two-thirds of the total cost of the work herein authorized shall be assessed against the property abutting thereon, and one-third of the said total cost to be assessed against the general revenue of the Town, said cost to include any and all street intersections and exemptions on corner lots and otherwise.

Section 3. Assessments for the special improvements herein authorized shall be payable within ninety days from the date of the approval thereof, the remaining payments to be likewise due and payable in each succeeding year, provided further, that payments of one-fifth, or excess thereof, may be made within the payment period. All deferred payments shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum, said interest beginning thirty days from the date of levy.

The adoption of this Ordinance was seconded by Councilman Taft, and upon a Yea and Nay vote, same was adopted. Voting Yea, Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen Heffner, Martin, Russell, Sidell and Taft. Voting Nay, none.

Regarding the request of Mr. Henry E. Preston for the construction of curb and gutter on Glengary Avenue, abutting Lot 5 in Block 6, of Wildwood Subdivision, committee recommended that this work be done, and after discussion of same Councilman Russell presented the following Ordinance, and moved its adoption:

ORDINANCE NO. 791

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

Section 1:

The owner of Lot 5 in Block 6, Wildwood Subdivision, having waived all legal requirements in the way of advertising and hearing for the construction of curb and gutter adjacent to said lot, the Municipal Works Committee is hereby authorized to construct this curb and gutter immediately, or as soon as possible, same to be constructed by the Superintendent of Public Works, and the Superintendent of Public Works is hereby authorized to construct same, and to hire any additional help necessary in connection with this improvement.

Section 2:

That assurance is made that the curb and gutter be constructed to proper grade, and that the cost of the work be held to a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00.

Section 3:

That the cost of the construction of this curb and gutter be assessed in the regular manner against the property owner abutting the improvement.

The adoption of this Ordinance was seconded by Councilman Heffner, and upon a Yea and Nay vote, same was adopted. Voting Yea, Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen Heffner, Martin, Russell, Sidell and Taft. Voting Nay, none.

LAW AND ORDINANCE COMMITTEE: Councilman Taft, Chairman, stated that he had nothing to report at this time.

CIVIC IMPROVEMENT AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE: Councilman Martin, Chairman, stated that the matter which he had intended taking up at this meeting, regarding the playgrounds, had been discussed earlier in the meeting, and that the procedure outlined in this discussion was recommended by the committee for approval by the Council, with the strict understanding that the Town entirely controlled the activities of all the Town Playgrounds, and that the Supervisors of said playgrounds would be appointed by the Town and paid from the Town's money as appropriated in the budget. Upon motion properly seconded the approval of this procedure in connection with the playgrounds was granted.

At this time Mayor Youngblood presented an application from Willard K. Bennett for use of the taxi-cab stand at Eastern and Laurel Avenues. Mayor Youngblood stated that the applicant had been investigated by the police and favorable report made. After discussion of this matter, Councilman Taft moved that the application be approved, and upon being seconded by Councilman Sidell, same was approved.

At this time Mayor Youngblood thanked the members of the Council for their cooperation throughout the year, and asked that if at any time they had any suggestions to make in connection with any work in the Town not within the jurisdiction of their committee, that these recommendations be made to the proper committee.

Mayor Youngblood also asked the Councilmen that they from time to time hold committee meetings, in order that matters may be gotten into better shape to present at the Council meetings.

Councilman Martin stated that he thought meetings by the Committees, in order to thrans out matters of importance, would eliminate a lot of discussion and could be handled at the Council meeting to a better understanding.

There being no further business to come before the Council, on motion properly seconded, Council adjourned at eleven o'clock P.M.

 MAYOR AND COUNCIL
 JUNE 29th, 1942

Meeting called to order at eight o'clock P. M. Those present were Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen Carr, Heffner, Martin, Russell and Sidell.

Meeting called for the purpose of making further Town appointments to serve for the ensuing year beginning July 1, 1942.

In reference to the matter of Building Inspector, after discussion, Councilman Sidell moved that Mr. Roy P. Frye be reappointed Building Inspector for the Town of Takoma Park for the ensuing year. This motion was seconded by Councilman Carr and approved.

With reference to the appointment of Electrical Inspector, Councilman Sidell moved that Mr. E. B. Fetty be reappointed Electrical Inspector for the Town of Takoma Park for the ensuing year. This motion was seconded by Council Martin and approved.

Councilman Russell moved the reappointment of William F. Fischer as Superintendent of Public works for the Town of Takoma

Park for the ensuing year, and upon being seconded by Councilman Heffner, this motion was approved.

Letter was read by the Clerk from Mr. Vernon B. Engeberg, asking the construction of curb and gutter abutting his property at the corner of Lincoln and Jackson Avenues. This communication was referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

A number of property owners from Larch Avenue in the Glaizewood Manor Subdivision, meet with the Mayor and Council regarding the improvement of Larch Avenue, same being in a very bad condition, due to washouts from heavy rains. It was explained to these people that the Town was ready to put this street in good passable shape just as soon as materials were available to do the work with.

The matter of permanent improvement of the street with concrete was discussed, and request made by these people that they be advised as to the approximate cost to each property owner for the permanent improvement of this street with concrete, and they were advised by Mayor Youngblood that this information would be given to them at the earliest possible moment.

At this time the Clerk presented the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 792

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

Section 1. That the Plat of resubdivision of Lot 6 in Block 69, Takoma Park Loan and Trust Co. Subdivision, into Lots 6-B and 6-C, as presented by Henry Breewood, Benjamin H. Melton and James M. Pickens, Trustees for the Disciples Missionary Union, be and the same is hereby approved.

The adoption of this Ordinance was moved by Councilman Russell and upon being seconded by Councilman Martin, same was approved on a Yea and Nay vote. Voting Yea, Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen Carr, Martin, Yeffner, Russell and Sidell. Voting Nay, none.

Councilman Martin stated that he had received recommendations of appointments for playground supervisors from the Parent-Teachers Assn. in connection with the Town Playgrounds for the present play-

ground season, and accompanying said recommendations was a program setting forth the activities for the playgrounds during the present playground season, and accompanying said recommendations was a program setting forth the activities for the playgrounds during the present summer season.

The following names were recommended by the Parent-Teachers Assn. for Supervisors:

Councilman Martin stated that he talked with Mrs. Rockwood in connection with these appointments, and that the above were highly recommended, and Councilman Martin moved that these Supervisors be appointed, and the schedule as outlined by the Parent-Teachers Assn. for the summer playgrounds of Takoma Park be adopted, and that Mrs. Mitchell, Miss Daley and Miss Graham be paid a salary of \$100.00 each per month, and that Mr. Penn be paid a salary of \$60.00 per month for the two months playground period. This motion was seconded by Councilman Sidell and approved.

The matter of appointment of Dog Officer for the Town of Takoma Park for the ensuing year was discussed, and upon motion of Councilman Heffner, seconded by Councilman Sidell, Adolph Dawes was reappointed as Dog Office for the ensuing year.

On motion properly seconded Council adjourned at 10:25 P. M.
