

SPECIAL MEETING  
MAYOR AND COUNCIL  
NOVEMBER 10, 1947

Meeting called to order at eight o'clock P.M. Those present were Mayor Youngblood, Councilmen, Heffner, Nies, Parkerson and Taft.

Councilman Taft stated that Mrs. James A. Robertson had called his attention to a law in Prince Georges County regarding special library tax, the law setting forth that in any incorporated areas where a library is maintained that the tax payers may be exempt from this tax by making application for such exemption. Takoma Park having a library which is supported by tax revenue, Councilman Taft suggested that it might be well to look into the matter in order to relieve the tax payers in that portion of the City located in Prince Georges County. After discussion of the matter the Corporation Counsel was requested to look into same and report back to Council.

Councilman Heffner also called attention to the fact that the residents of Takoma Park within the Prince Georges area were also paying a fire tax but that they received no fire protection from the County, protection to these residents coming from the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Dept.

Councilman Taft also called attention to the fact that Mr. Roscoe Gray, who owns Lots 28, 29 and 30 in Block 37, Gilbert's Subdivision, had made request that Lincoln Avenue between Jackson Avenue and Carroll Avenue be widened to conform to the width of the street abutting his lots, as he desired to build on same but before doing so would like to have the street widened. After discussion of this matter the Clerk was instructed to have Engineer McNeill to look into same and have a dedication plat drawn up in an effort to procure sufficient dedication to widen Lincoln Ave. abutting those lots from which dedication had not been made.

The Clerk read a communication to Council from the League of Women Voters regarding the proposed reorganization of the Fire Dept., and this communication was referred to Councilman Post, Chairman of the Special Fire Department Committee.

The matter of need for an Assistant Superintendent of Public Works to assist Supt. of Public Works Fischer was discussed at length, after which Councilman Nies moved that an increased effort be made to find a suitable assistant to the Supt. of Public Works. This motion was seconded by Councilman Parkerson and approved.

Councilman Taft brought before the Council a report which was presented to the Community League of Takoma Park by the chairman of its Civic Improvement Committee, regarding the matter of adequate police for the city of Takoma Park. Discussion concerning the matter was had by the Mayor and Council. Upon motion of Councilman Parkinson, seconded by Councilman Nies, it was voted, That the Mayor and Councilman give consideration and study to the matter, looking forward to the addition of one or more police

for the city of Takoma Park.

Councilman Nies reported to the Council that he had interviewed Dr. DeVoe Meade, of the Washington Sanitarium and Hospital, regarding Dr. Meade's accepting the position of City Health Officer, and that Dr. Meade had consented to accept such position for a nominal salary. Thereupon, upon motion of Councilman Nies, seconded by Councilman Parkinson, it was voted, To employ Dr. Meade at a salary of \$25.00 per month for the period ending June 30, 1948.

A letter from Mrs. Lois S. ~~Browning~~ <sup>St. Browning</sup> was read regarding the loss of some tulip bulbs owned by her, which letter was referred to the Corporation Council.

The question regarding the enforcement of the trailer ordinance was considered. It was voted, That the police be requested to make a check of the trailers now located in the city of Takoma Park and report back to the Mayor and Council.

Upon motion by Councilman Parkinson, seconded by Councilman Nies, it was voted, To hold the regular monthly meeting of the Mayor and Council November 24 instead of the 17th, due to the absence from the city of three members of the City Council.

Upon motion of Councilman Nies, the Council adjourned at 11:00 o'clock P.M.

COMMUNICATIONS: From Atty. J. Douglas Bradshaw, regarding apartment house development at Grant, Hancock and Lee Avenues, and requesting information regarding storm water drainage from same. Referred to Municipal Works Committee.

From E. V. Hogan requesting the Council to sell to him the 20 ft. lot adjoining his residents, between lots 4 and 5, Block 78, T.P.L. & T. Subdivision. Referred to the Corporation Counsel.

From Mrs. Philip W. Woods, Chairman, Takoma Park Study Group, League of Women Voters of Montgomery County, advising the Council that they had requested the Montgomery County Commission not to grant any more zoning petitions until a master plan for zoning is made available.

Report from Police Dept. for the month of October, 1947 showing total arrests 200 and total calls and complaints 198.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Bills in the amount of \$4767.46 <sup>were</sup> presented by the finance Committee and ordered paid.

At this time Mayor Youngblood advised that Council would be glad to hear anyone regarding the construction of storm water sewer as advertised in Ordinance No. 903. Mr. R. C. Johnson, owner of Lots 1, 2, and 3 in Block 1, N. H. Ave. Hg. Subdivision, addressed council and protested the charging of the cost of this storm water sewer to Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1, New Hampshire Ave. Hg. Subdivision as this water comes from neighboring Properties. After discussion, the matter was referred back to the Municipal Works Committee.

Mr. W. Douglas, 6833 Eastern Ave., addressed council regarding the grading and paving of Eastern Ave. by the District of Columbia which left his mother's driveway on Eastern Avenue high and necessitated the relaying of the sidewalk. Referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

Mr. Carl Fishel, 231 Willow Avenue, addressed council and asked for information regarding the taking over of the Fire Dept. by the City. Mr. Fishel was informed that the deed is ready to be signed and a meeting of the Trustees of the Fire Dept. and a special committee of the Council would be held in a few days. Mr. Fishel also asked information regarding a definite program of the bond issue and was told that no specific plans had been made.

Mr. M. J. Menocal, contractor, building on Sligo Parkway, addressed Council regarding storm water in this area and discussed with Council ways of controlling this storm water. Mr. Menocal was advised to get in writing 100% of the property owners consent to pave the Lane in the rear of Sligo Parkway and this work could be done without advertising and a hearing.

Mr. A. A. Waechter, 911 Sligo Parkway also addressed Council regarding the paving of this Lane.

Mrs. M. J. Latimer, 208 Hodges Lane addressed Council and asked questions regarding the collection of trash and refuse and Ordinances covering same.

Mrs. E. S. Browning, 7211 Central Avenue, addressed Council regarding her letter to Mr. Bradshaw, Corporation Counsel asking that \$40.00 be paid her for the loss of a basket of valuable bulbs taken from her door step on a trash collection day. This matter was discussed and referred back to council for consideration.

Dr. W. P. McNeill, 8107 Roanoke Avenue, addressed Council and asked that a sidewalk be put in in front of his property to extend from the present sidewalk to the end of his property. Dr. McNeill was advised to write a letter to the Mayor and Council asking that this sidewalk be installed.

Mr. Luke Bennett, 211 Maple Avenue, addressed council and stated that he is one of a committee investigating the police situation here and would like to know what action the council has taken regarding the appointment of another police officer. Mr. Bennett was advised that the Municipal Service Committee is studying this matter now.

Mrs. Wm. F. Fischer, 112 New York Avenue, addressed council and expressed the hope that when the City takes over the Fire Department that it will make the hall a real Community Hall. Mrs. Fischer also addressed Council regarding the Montgomery County Chest Xray program and asked Council to give the Mobil Unit when it comes to Takoma Park a suitable place to operate from. Mrs. Fischer called to the Council's attention the fact that a dwelling is being built on Buffalo Avenue and is not in line with the other dwellings on that Street. Mrs. Fischer was advised that this would be investigated.

The matter of the Montgomery County Chest Xray program was discussed and Councilman Heffner made a motion that the City endorse and back the movement of the Montgomery County Chest Xray survey. This motion was seconded by Councilman Nies and approved.

The use of the Official Stand for the Mobile Unit while in Takoma Park was discussed and Councilman Parkerson made a motion that the stand be used by the Mobile Unit while in Takoma Park. This motion was seconded by Councilman Taft and approved.

Councilman Post stated that the special Committee of the Council would meet with the Trustees of the Fire Department on Wednesday evening, December 3, 1947, to go over arrangement for the City to take over the Fire Department.

Councilman Post read communication from Mr. J. P. Mannion, Director, Board of Trustees Employees' Retirement System, concerning participation of employees of Takoma Park in the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Maryland. This communication was ordered held until further information was received from Mr. Mannion.

**MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE:** Councilman Anderson, Chairman, called attention of Council to letter of State Roads Commission written to Rev. H. R. Hodgson concerning the bad condition of street at the intersection of New Hampshire Avenue and Kentland Avenue, and the Clerk was requested to take this matter up with the State Roads commission.

The letter from Corp. Counsel J. D. Bradshaw regarding the apartment development that is to be erected at Lee and Hancock Avenues, the matter of storm water drainage was discussed and Councilman Anderson made motion that the developer of this project be given permission to divert the surface water into catch basin at Lee and Hancock Avenues. This motion was seconded by Councilman Nies and approved.

**MUNICIPAL SERVICE COMMITTEE:** Councilman Heffner brought up for discussion the matter of Mrs. Browning's bulbs, and after discussion the Clerk was requested to write Mr. Browning and state that the Council felt they cannot pay this claim without positive proof that the bulbs were taken by a town employee.

Mayor Youngblood called to attention of Council an invitation from the League of Women Voters to attend a meeting of the League at 8 Columbia Avenue on the evening of December 3, 1947, and asked all who were able to be present.

Councilman Heffner brought up the matter of recreational center for the Negro population of the City, and after discussion of same, Councilman Heffner moved that a request be sent to the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission requesting that they give study to the matter of establishing a recreation center in the City of Takoma Park for the Negro population. This motion was seconded by Councilman Nies and approved.

Regarding the hearing this evening in connection with the construction of storm sewer abutting Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 1, New Hampshire Avenue Highlands, Councilman Anderson recommended the installation of this sewer and moved the adoption of the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 904

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

Section 1. That under authority granted by Section 965 of the City Charter, the Mayor and Council, after due advertising and hearing as provided therein, are of the opinion that the public health, safety and comfort require the construction of storm water sewer as advertised in Ordinance No. 903, adopted by the Mayor and Council October 20, 1947, said

improvement being the construction of storm water sewer abutting Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1, New Hampshire Avenue Highlands Sub-division, Takoma Park, Prince Georges County, Maryland.

Section 2. That the Municipal Works Committee be authorized to proceed immediately, or as soon as possible, in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter, to construct storm water sewer as set forth in Section 1, and the Superintendent of Public Works is hereby authorized to proceed with this work and to employ any additional help necessary in the construction of same.

Section 3. That assurance is made that the cost of this work will be held to a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00.

Section 4. That the cost of the construction of storm water sewer herein authorized be assessed against the abutting property in the regular manner.

Adoption of this Ordinance was seconded by Councilman Nies and on a Yea and Nay vote same was adopted, voting Yea Councilman Anderson, Heffner, Nies, Parkerson, Post and Taft; voting Nay, none.

Regarding the matter of sidewalk in front of 6833 Eastern Ave., about which Mr. Willard Douglas addressed Council, Superintendent of Public Works Fischer was requested to look into the matter and do whatever possible to correct the condition complained of by Mr. Douglas.

On motion properly seconded, Council adjourned at 10:45 P. M.

COMMUNICATIONS: From Ellery Dennison, Chairman of the Hillwood Manor Improvement Committee. Referred to the Municipal Works Committee.

From Walter H. Allison, 1110 Flower Avenue, requesting "One Hour Parking" limit in front of his place of business. Referred to the Municipal Service Committee.

From R. S. Michael, Commander, Disabled American Veterans, Takoma Park Chapter #7, Takoma Park, Md., thanking the Mayor and Council for the use of 8 Columbia Avenue and asking permission to continue the use of this building for their meetings, and also asking permission to place their Charter in the meeting room.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Bills in amount of \$8,223.73 were presented by the Finance Committee and ordered paid.

Mrs. John H. Hardy, 7200 Hilton Avenue, addressed council regarding warning ticket that was put on their truck which they had been parking in front of their home on Hilton Avenue, and asked what could be done about this, as they had no other place to park the truck. Mrs. Hardy also presented a petition signed by residents in that vicinity who did not object to the truck being parked in Hilton Ave.

Mr. R. S. Johnson addressed council regarding the storm water sewer that is to be constructed abutting Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1, New Hampshire Avenue Highlands Subdivision, and objected strenuously to the construction of this storm water sewer, and asked the council to reconsider charging him alone for the construction of this storm water sewer. After discussion the matter was held up for further study.

Mr. Robert Garrison, 6749 Eastern Avenue addressed council regarding the retaining wall on Eastern Avenue, in the 6700 block (D.C. side) and asked why this wall was allowed to be put up and if something could be done regarding it. The matter was discussed and the parties concerned were told to wait until the street is finished and the matter would be taken up with the proper party in D. C.

Mrs. Phil Woods, 313 Ethan Allen, representing the League of Women Voters, addressed council regarding report on negotiations between the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Department, and the City of Takoma Park. Mrs. Woods was told that all arrangements have not been completed.

Mr. Earl J. Opal addressed Council and asked if plans were being made to improve Houston Avenue between Roanoke Avenue and Sligo Parkway. Mr. Opal was advised that the paving of Houston Avenue was held up on account of no sanitary sewer in that street. Referred to the Municipal Service Committee.

Taxicab owner's application of Norman L. Elliott, to take over Cab #12 from A. S. Fenwick was presented to council, and upon motion of Councilman Parkerson, seconded by Councilman Nies, taxicab owner's application of Norman L. Elliott was approved.

The matter of "One Hour" parking limit in front of 1110 Flower Avenue, was discussed, and Councilman Parkerson made a motion that the Clerk write the State Roads Commission for permission to allow "One Hour" parking in front of 1110 Flower Avenue. This motion was seconded by Councilman Nies and approved.

The matter of parking commercial vehicles in front of a private resident was discussed and the Clerk was requested to notify Mr. John H. Hardy of 7200 Hilton Avenue that it is not within the power of the Council to allow the parking of a truck in front of his residence.

Councilman Parkerson presented to Council an inventory of equipment of the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Department and stated that same was not in complete form and that this matter would be taken up at a later date.

Officer John Whiddon addressed Council and asked permission to take two weeks off without pay, from December 15th to December 13st, and after discussion same was granted to Officer Whiddon.

HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE: Regarding the letter from the Disabled War Veterans, T. P. Chapter #7, Councilman Heffner made a motion that the Disabled War Veterans, T. P. Chapter #7, be allowed the use of the building at 8 Columbia Avenue to hold their meetings and to display their Charter, but that the City of Takoma Park would not be responsible in case of loss or damage to Charter. This motion was seconded by Councilman Parkerson and approved.

MUNICIPAL WORKS COMMITTEE: Regarding the storm Water sewer to be constructed abutting Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1, N. H. Ave. Highlands, Roy S. Johnson, owner, after discussion it was decided that Councilmen Post and Nies would meet with Major Fischer on Wednesday morning, December 17th at 8:45 A. M., at Merwood and Wildwood Dr., to make a further study of this proposed sewer.

Mayor Youngblood presented to council a list of Tax sale properties on which the Montgomery County Commissioners hold the deed, and brought up the question of whether or not it was advisable for the City of Takoma Park to take these properties back from the County Commissioners. After discussing the matter, Councilman Nies moved that the City of Takoma Park arrange with Montgomery County Commissioners to take deed to these properties. This motion was seconded by Councilman Parkerson and approved.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 905
