## RECOGNIZING THE 70th ANNIVERSARY OF MONTGOMERY COLLEGE

WHEREAS,	on September 16, 1946, the first Montgomery Junior College classes were held in the evening in a local high school with a student body of 186 men and women; and
WHEREAS,	in August 1950, the Montgomery County Board of Education purchased the Bliss Electrical School in Takoma Park for \$350,000 in order to use its seven-acre campus, six buildings, and equipment for its original campus; and
WHEREAS,	the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus is home to the largest associate's degree nursing program in the State of Maryland as well as other high quality health science programs such as medical sonography, radiologic technology, polysomnography, physical therapy assisting, surgical technology, emergency management, and health information management; and
WHEREAS,	the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus enrolls students from all MCPS high schools including large numbers from Blair, Northwood, Blake, Kennedy, Springbrook, and Paint Branch; and
WHEREAS,	the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus offers signature programs in the visual and performing arts and is home to premier arts facilities such as the Cultural Arts Center and the Cafritz Family Foundation Arts Center; and
WHEREAS,	Takoma Park/Silver Spring English professor, Dr. Greg Wahl, was named Maryland Professor of the Year for 2013; and
WHEREAS,	the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus hosts the Holy Cross Health Community Clinic and the College's Refugee Training Center; and
WHEREAS,	approximately 90% of Montgomery College students remain in Maryland and contribute to the state's economic growth, strengthening the local economy by \$1.8 billion through College
