**ORDINANCE NO. 2011-41
(2011 Takoma Park City Election)**

WHEREAS, Section 606(a) of the City Charter provides that an election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in odd-numbered years for the election of a Mayor and six Councilmembers; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter, in Section 607, states that the Council has the power to provide by Ordinance for the conduct of City elections generally and shall designate a convenient polling place, the manner of holding City elections, and the voting system to be used for the City election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAKOMA PARK, MARYLAND:

SECTION 1. The City Clerk shall call a Nominating Caucus of qualified voters of the City of Takoma Park for the nomination of candidates for Mayor and Councilmembers on Tuesday, October 4, 2011, at 7:30 p.m., in the Takoma Park Community Center – Sam Abbott Citizens’ Center, 7500 Maple Avenue, Takoma Park, Maryland; said Nominating Caucus to be conducted as follows:

- A. Nominations of candidates for Mayor shall immediately precede all ward nominations of candidates for City Council;
- B. Nominations of candidates for City Council shall be taken in the following order: Ward 5, Ward 4, Ward 1, Ward 2, Ward 6, Ward 3. This order was determined by a random drawing conducted by the Board of Elections on September 7, 2011.

SECTION 2. A City Election shall be held at the Community Center on Tuesday, November 8, 2011, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of electing a Mayor and six Councilmembers, as follows:

- A. The Mayor shall be elected at large and one Councilmember for each ward shall be elected by the voters of that ward only;
- B. Votes shall be cast in the City Election by paper ballots;
- C. An instant runoff voting system shall be used to allow voters to rank candidates in order of choice;

- D. Scantegrity election verification technology shall be available for use by voters who vote in person or by absentee ballot, allowing voters to confirm online after the election that their votes were counted;
- E. Absentee voting shall be permitted as set forth in Title 5, Elections, Chapter 5.20, Absentee Voting, of the Takoma Park Code; and
- F. If eligible, an individual shall be permitted to cast a provisional ballot as set forth in Title 5, Elections, Chapter 5.22, Provisional Ballots, of the Takoma Park Code.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall provide paper ballots for the City Election and sufficient voting stations for use by voters. The names of candidates for Mayor, arranged alphabetically, shall appear first on all ballots, followed by the names of candidates for Councilmember, arranged alphabetically, with each ward ballot displaying the names of candidates for that ward only. The name of any candidate nominated at the Nominating Caucus who, within three days of the Nominating Caucus, files a written declination of candidacy with the City Clerk shall not appear on the ballot.

SECTION 4. If any eligible person registers as a write-in candidate for Mayor or Councilmember in accordance with Section 605 of the City Charter, then the City Clerk shall arrange to have her/his name posted in the appropriate voting booth(s) for the purpose of identifying her/him as a candidate for office.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall arrange for a space on the ballot for write-in votes.

SECTION 6. The City Clerk shall include on all ballots any advisory referendum question so adopted by resolution passed by a majority of the Council pursuant to Section 611 of the City Charter. Any advisory referendum question shall appear last on all ballots, after the names of the candidates for Mayor and Councilmember.

SECTION 7. Notice of the Nominating Caucus and the City Election shall be published in the Takoma Park Newsletter and at least once in the Takoma Park Gazette during the two weeks prior to October 4, 2011. In addition, a specimen ballot, showing the arrangement of the candidates' names, offices, Councilmember wards, and any advisory referendum questions which will appear on the City Election ballot, shall be published in the Takoma Park Newsletter preceding the election.

SECTION 8. The City Clerk shall supply voter lists bearing the names and addresses of all eligible voters, as certified by the Montgomery County Board of Elections, and shall supply such lists to the Board of Elections on election day. The voter registration information for all eligible non-United States citizens (names and addresses) who have registered with the City Clerk's office to vote in City elections shall be incorporated into the voter lists.

SECTION 9. Members of the Takoma Park Board of Elections shall serve as Election Judges and shall recommend to the Council the names of additional persons to be designated as Election Judges for the 2011 City Election.

SECTION 10. Optical scan technology provided by the Scantegrity Voting Systems Team shall be used to tabulate the votes, but all tabulations remain subject to review and certification by the Takoma Park Board of Elections.

SECTION 11. Following the closing of the City Election polls, the Election Judges shall ensure the secrecy of the ballot, correct counting of votes on ballots on which the proper number of votes has been indicated, the tabulating and recording of votes by ward for or against any candidate or question, and the prompt reporting of election returns after the official closing of the polls.

SECTION 12. In each race, the candidate receiving a majority of votes shall be declared elected. If no candidate receives a majority of first choices, the Election Judges shall conduct an instant runoff consisting of additional rounds of ballot counting as set out in Section 606(e) through 606(h) of the City Charter. Instructions provided to voters shall conform substantially to the specifications of Section 606(c) of the City Charter.

SECTION 13. The Board of Elections shall meet in the Community Center – Sam Abbott Citizens’ Center on Wednesday, November 9, 2011, and shall determine and certify the results of the election to the Council, as provided in City Charter Section 612.

SECTION 14. The Council shall hold a Special Meeting in the Community Center – Sam Abbott Citizens’ Center at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 9, 2011, to receive the certification of the election results from the Board of Elections.

SECTION 15. This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
