WHEREAS,	the original Nuclear-Free Act: (1) prohibited the production of nuclear weapons within the City, (2) contemplated a socially responsible investment policy, specifically limiting City investments in nuclear weapons producers, (3) generally prohibited City purchases from nuclear weapons producers, and (4) included a city council-appointed resident committee, the Nuclear-Free Takoma Park Committee to assist in implementing these provisions; and
WHEREAS.	a 2021 city council review of all city council-appointed commissions, boards &
,	committees, undertaken to strengthen committee effectiveness and be more
	representative of the community as a whole, recommended, based on a set of
	common factors applied to all such groups, restructuring or discontinuing several

1		Article 1. Advisory Committees - General Provisions.
2 3	2.1	6.010 Advisory Committees.
4		The City Council may establish by ordinance any advisory committee it deems necessary. In
5 6		addition to other duties assigned, advisory committees are charged with:
7 8		1. Providing the City Council with tangible recommendations in key priority areas.
9 10		2. Leveraging residents' technical expertise and lived experiences to inform City policies and programs.
11		
12 13		3. Ensuring that the Council has regular and timely information to use when considering its priorities or important issues.
14		
15 16		4. Providing an opportunity to engage residents on issues that are important to them as well as to assist in community education and engagement activities in their priority areas.
17		
18 19	В.	The authority of such entities is limited to that extended to it by the City Council.
20 21 22 23 24	C.	Each Committee is required to report the status of its work annually or at the request of the City Council. Council shall review each committee's report and may concurrently undertake a review of each Committee's purpose, duties, other assigned tasks, and adjust them as necessary.
25 26 27	D.	Membership of advisory committees shall be in accordance with the provisions of this section unless otherwise provided by City Code.
27 28 29		1. Only City residents may serve on a committee.
30 31 32		2. Individuals interested in serving on a committee may apply in accordance with procedures and time frames set forth by the City Council and shall be confirmed and appointed by a majority vote of City Council.
33 34 35 36 37		3. A member who has served on a committee for six years continuously, may not be reappointed to the same committee until one year has elapsed since the end of that member's previous tenure.
38 39 40		4. A member who is term limited may apply to serve on a Committee for which the member is not term limited.
41 42	E.	Organization.
42 43 44 45		1. Unless otherwise stated in the Code or directed by Council, each advisory committee should consist of up to nine members.

1 2		2. Each committee shall operate under a common set of procedural rules, which shal be prepared by the City Attorney's office and be approved by Council.
3		
4		3. Each committee shall elect from its members the following officers: chairperson
5		vice chairperson, and secretary. Officers shall serve for a period of one year at which time
6		each committee shall elect again the officers. The chairperson shall be elected annually
7		but may only serve in that capacity for two consecutive years. The Chairperson may no
8 9		hold two offices simultaneously.
9	Б	Meetings.
11	1.	Needings.
12		1. Committees shall meet at least quarterly or as often as required to fulfill their
12		purposes.
14		purposes.
15		2. All meetings shall be open to the public and are subject to Maryland's Oper
16		Meetings Act. Meeting notices and agendas shall be prepared and submitted to the City
17		Clerk and posted in advance of any committee meeting in accordance with State law
18		Written records of proceedings and attendance shall be maintained by the committee and
19		provided to the City Clerk for safe keeping. A report on the activities of each committee
20		shall be submitted to the City Clerk and Council once per year.
21		
22		3. Meetings shall be held at times that facilitate and allow for committee member
23		attendance and ease of public attendance.
24		
25		4. A majority of a committee shall constitute a quorum.
26		
27		5. Meetings shall take place at a City government building or other publicly accessible
28 29		location approved by the City Manager. The meetings may occur in person or virtually, so long as such is announced in advance. Meetings may include a virtual attendance option
29 30		for members and for the public.
31		for memoers and for the public.
32		6. At least three members of every committee must maintain current Open Meetings
33		Act certification and provide a copy of the certification to the City Clerk.
34		
35	G.	Each committee shall designate an individual who shall be responsible for preparing meeting
36		agendas and minutes, and coordinate publishing and storage of the same with the City Clerk.
37		
38	H.	Staff liaison. The City Manager shall assign a member of the City staff to act as a staff liaison
39		to each committee, who shall provide general support to the committee.
40		
41	I.	Member Conduct.
42		
43		<u>1.</u> Members are expected to attend each meeting of the committee on which they
44		serve. Members may miss a scheduled meeting for cause.
45		

<u>2.</u> Members are expected to adhere to the Code of Conduct established by the Code of Conduct for Council-Appointed Members of Boards, Committees, Commissions, and Task Forces (Resolution 2020-22, Oct. 7, 2020).

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<u>3.</u> Council, by resolution, may remove a member from their position upon finding a violation of the Code of Conduct, no longer meeting the requirements for membership, or otherwise not fulfilling the duties of a member.

9 2.16.020 Terms of advisory committees.

A. Except as noted elsewhere in this Chapter, beginning in 2021, the initial term for half of a
committee's members will end on June 30, 2022. The initial term for the other half of a
committee's members' terms will begin in 2021 and end June 30, 2023. If there are an odd number
of appointees, the odd number appointee shall be considered part of the term having the later
expiration date.

B. Except as noted elsewhere in this Chapter, after the initial terms have expired, all terms of
office will be staggered terms of two years. Said terms shall begin on July 1st and end June 30th.

C. The total terms of office for members of a committee shall be no more than six continuous
years unless otherwise provided in this Chapter.

D. A member appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve the remainder of the term of office that
became vacant.

5	Article 8. Nuclear-Free Takoma Park Committee
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7	2.16.230 Committee established.
8	There is established a Nuclear Free Takoma Park Committee. Committee members shall have
9	collective experience in the areas of science, research, finance, law, peace and ethics.
10	
11	2.16.240 Statement of purpose.
12	The purpose of the Nuclear-Free Takoma Park Committee is to fulfill the duties and
13	responsibilities assigned to it by the City Code and to perform such other tasks as Council may
14	direct from time to time.
15	
16	2.16.250 Duties and responsibilities.
17	The Committee shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
18	A. The Committee may review any work within the City which it has reason to believe is not in
19	compliance with Section 14.04.040 of the Takoma Park Nuclear Free Zone Act. The Committee
20	shall notify the City Council and the City Manager of a suspected violation of this the Takoma
21	Park Nuclear-Free Zone Act.
22	B. The Committee shall review existing City contracts, awards, purchase orders and investments
23	and may review proposed contracts, awards, purchase orders and investments to assure compliance
24	with Sections 14.04.050 and 14.04.060 of the Takoma Park Nuclear Free Zone Act. If the
25	Committee finds any contracts, awards, purchase orders or investments in violation of this the
26	Takoma Park Nuclear-Free Zone Act, it shall, in conjunction with the City Manager, make
27	recommendations to the Mayor and Council regarding the existence of reasonable alternatives.
28	C. The Committee, in conjunction with the City Manager, shall propose a socially responsible
29	investment policy and implementation plan as specified in Section 14.04.050 and, upon the
30	adoption of the policy and plan, shall annually thereafter review the investment policy to ensure
31	its conformity to this the Takoma Park Nuclear-Free Zone Act.
32	D. The Committee shall, through the collection of materials, newsletter articles, cable television
33	programming, public forums and other means, provide public education and information on issues
34	related to the intent and purpose of the Takoma Park Nuclear Free Zone Act. In performing this
35	task, the Committee shall cooperate with City staff, the Nuclear Freeze Task Force and other
36	interested community groups and individuals.
37	E. The Committee shall maintain a collection of current materials concerning the production of
38	nuclear weapons and the components thereof and the transportation of high level nuclear waste
39	resulting from the production of nuclear weapons and nuclear energy. From this information and
40	from consultations with individuals and organizations involved in the nuclear weapons and nuclear
41	energy debate, the Committee shall annually prepare and report to the City Council a list of nuclear
42	weapons producers to guide the City, its officials, staff and agents in the implementation of
43	Sections 14.04.050 and 14.04.060 of the Takoma Park Nuclear Free Zone Act. The Committee
44	shall also make recommendations to the City Council from this information and from consultations
45	with individuals and organizations involved in the transportation of high-level nuclear waste on
46	how best to promote the safety and welfare of the City from harmful exposure to high-level nuclear

- F. Before a waiver of the provisions of Sections 14.04.060(A), (B) or (C) pursuant to Section
 14.04.060(F) may be sought, the Committee, in conjunction with the City Manager or his or her
 designee, shall conduct a diligent search to determine the availability of reasonable alternative
- 5 sources for a necessary product or service, except, however, the City Manager or his or her 6 designed and/or the Committee's unwillingness or inshility to conduct such a construct shell not
- 6 designee and/or the Committee's unwillingness or inability to conduct such a search shall not 7 proclude actions by the Mayor and Council pursuant to Section 14.04.060(E). (Ord. 2005, 20 (nort))
