



Recognizing City Resident Dorothy L. Barnes



- WHEREAS** Dorothy Barnes has for many years served on the board of directors of Historic Takoma, Inc. as the organization's Historian, and has devoted countless volunteer hours researching, organizing, documenting, and preserving, the City's history; and
- WHEREAS** Dorothy Barnes has devoted countless volunteer hours assisting others to understand better: (1) the origins of our City's public and private institutions and our built environment, and, (2) the history of the many City residents who came before us and their contributions to the development of the City; and
- WHEREAS** Dorothy Barnes has, during her entire lifetime, extolled the many virtues of the City and promoted goodwill within the community.
