### **RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE 2016 COUNCIL PRIORITIES**

- WHEREAS, Councilmembers will revisit the priorities as needed including at their 2017 Annual Retreat, and reaffirm and/or revise them as necessary.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the City of Takoma Park formally affirms the 2016 Council Priorities.
