Stormwater Fee Notice

Single family property owners should have received in the mail a brochure on the new stormwater fee for your home. The new fee is based on the amount of your impervious area, and will appear on your property tax bill. If you think there's an error in your impervious area, submit an Application for Correction that can be found on the City's <u>Stormwater webpage</u>. If necessary, Public Works schedules site visits to confirm impervious area measurements. If there is a property line error, the City will refer your application to the County for a property line correction. Later this year, the city will turn to the process for how homeowners can get credit for work done to capture and/or filter stormwater.

COVID-19 Dashboard

Each week, the City continues to update the COVID-19 Dashboard found here: COVID 19 Dashboard. There were 4 new cases of COVID-19 reported in Takoma Park in the last week, bringing the city's total to 1,732. The 7-day rolling average of new cases per 100,000 residents in the county and city also ticked-up slightly in the last week. The total vaccinated residents in Takoma Park increased by 212 and the total number of residents with at least one vaccine increased by 214 in the last week, bringing the total number of fully-vaccinated residents to 12,664 (71.7% of the city's population) and the total number of residents with at least one vaccine to 14,439 (81.7%). There were no new deaths due to COVID-19 reported in the 20912 zip code in the last week.

Vaccinations Available!

Unvaccinated residents are encouraged to get vaccinated. Current vaccines have been shown to be effective at both preventing people from getting the more-contagious Delta variant and reducing the severity of symptoms from the Delta variant.
