Information to Share

Greater Washington Community Foundation – Top 5 Finalists for Racial Equity Grant Although we just learned that we were not selected, we wanted to share that the City and Fairfax County, together, were one of five finalists nationwide for a grant aimed at improving economic mobility for workers of color. The Mayor and Deputy City Manager met last month with representatives of the awarding organization, the National Fund for Workforce Solutions, and the Greater Washington Community Foundation, the organization which submitted the grant application, to discuss the City's efforts on racial equity and how the grant funding might be used. It is impressive that we made it as far as we did in the process, and we will continue to seek opportunities with the Community Foundation and other organizations who share our values and interests in addressing racial inequities.
