A quick note that the second Council Retreat meeting that was originally scheduled for Tuesday, January 29 has been rescheduled to Tuesday, February 5. The meeting will begin at 6:30 pm in the Hydrangea Room.

December Incident Involving K9 Officer

As you know, in December there was a terrible incident where a Takoma Park police dog bit a Washington, D.C. resident. The police officer who works with the trained police dog was in pursuit of people who had stolen a vehicle but the police dog acted in an unexpected way and bit a resident walking in the area. The incident occurred just across the line into Washington, D.C. The police dog has been recertified since the incident, but we have chosen to keep the dog out of service. Investigations are being conducted internally by the Takoma Park Police Department and by the Metropolitan Police Department Internal Affairs Unit. Our investigation has effectively concluded and we are awaiting information from the MPD regarding theirs before issuing a formal statement.

Last night, we received a letter from DC Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B, where the incident occurred, with questions about our response and Police Department policies and procedures related to 1) the use of K-9 officers and 2) cross-jurisdictional operations/operations in boundary areas. The ANC requested a response by February 15. We should have a response to them within the next few days.
