Independence Day Festivities

The Takoma Park Independence Day Committee has been unsuccessful in finding a suitable alternative location for the evening fireworks display this year, which would need to be relocated due to construction activity at Takoma Park Middle School. The committee is now planning a musical celebration on Maple Avenue during the July 4th evening. While logistics still need to be worked out, the Committee envisions one or two stages for musicians along a closed section of Maple Avenue from Philadelphia Avenue to about Ritchie Avenue. The usual street vendors will be invited.

It is worth noting that some community members have asked the Committee to consider replacing the fireworks celebration in the future with another format for various reasons, including environmental impact, and/or harmful effects on children and animals. We believe that the proposed alternative this year will be a good opportunity to measure community reception of a non-fireworks program – and we hope to see a great turnout!

Light It Up Blue

In honor of Autism Awareness and Acceptance Month, the City of Takoma Park Recreation Department, Montgomery Parks and the City of Rockville Recreation and Parks, have collaborated to host "Light it Up Blue," an all-inclusive event to increase the understanding and acceptance of autism. The family-friendly event will take place Saturday, April 6, from 5–8 p.m. at the Agricultural History Farm Park in Derwood, Md. Summer Youth Employment Program

The City of Takoma Park is pleased to announce the return of the City's Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP). Since 2014, The Summer Youth Employment Program has

provided hands-on work opportunities for our youth. Young people ages 16-21 receive a unique opportunity to explore their interests and discover new ones through the work program. For eight weeks (June 24th to August 17th) participants are placed in jobs around the community and paid through the program. The Recreation Department provides on-site training, resume-building and workshops in an effort to better prepare our youth to find jobs outside of school.

Over 40 parents and teens attended the Interest Meeting last Friday, March 29. Leicia Monfort, along with the support of Javonte McDonald, provided an overview of what is to be expected. The next steps will be the selection process, followed by professional development classes. The Summer Youth Employment Program provides young people with a summer-long adventure that is more than just a job, but a true learning experience.
