## Information to Share

## Montgomery County May Move to Phase 2 Reopening Next Week

County Executive Marc Elrich announced that Montgomery County is likely to allow some additional reopening activities to occur in Montgomery County some time next week. Check the Montgomery County web page for more information as the situation remains fluid. Please note that City of Takoma Park governmental facilities remain closed to the public and most work will continue to be done remotely except for Public Works and Police services. The Police Department is open for emergency services and can be accessed through the Police Lobby on the lower level of Maple Avenue. Please wear a mask when entering the building.

## **Laurel Avenue Road Closure**

Consistent with City Council Resolution 2020-13, staff is working with businesses and reviewing public and private spaces across Takoma Park to support small businesses and advance public health by allowing the use of those spaces for outdoor seating, sales and customer pickup. Tomorrow, June 11, the business side travel lane of Laurel Avenue will close to allow for foot traffic and outdoor seating at and near businesses in the area. The layout of the space here and elsewhere around the City is to be done to reinforce social distancing protocols and handicapped accessibility. I have temporarily waived all fees for outdoor seating permits during the COVID-19 restrictions. Staff will be monitoring the operations of the spaces and will make adjustments as needed to meet the safety and other goals of the Council Resolution. # **Federal Communications Commission Declaratory Order**

The FCC took action on small cell tower regulations yesterday and we are awaiting information on the details of their action. The preliminary indication was that the FCC was going to act to

expand flexibility for the small cell industry and reduce local governmental control. The City of Takoma Park partnered on legal action by a number of municipalities contesting that approach.

## **Takoma Park Youth Council**

The Takoma Park Youth Council is accepting applications for new members until June 30 for rising 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students. The Youth Council was created three years ago as an advisory committee to the City Council, representing the interests of youth in our city government.
