Election Information

The City of Takoma Park has sent out ballots to registered voters and folks have been receiving them. There have been quite a few people dropping off their Takoma Park ballots in the Community Center drop box. There will be additional ballots sent out or available to those who registered late or did not receive a ballot. Remember, if you are a Takoma Park resident who will be 16 years old on or before November 3, 2020, you are eligible to vote, even if you are not a U.S. citizen. Questions? Regarding the County/Presidential ballots, while it is too late to have a ballot mailed to you, it is not too late to mail it in if you have one. If you have a ballot, rather than mailing it, you may wish to drop it off at one of the County drop boxes. The silver box at the Community Center is one of the official County/Presidential drop boxes. If you have requested a mail-in ballot, mailed in a ballot, or dropped a ballot into a County drop box, you can check to see the status of your ballot. Go to Check Ballot Status to see if a ballot has been sent to you or to see if the Board of Elections has received your completed ballot. It is only shown as received after the elections staff run the ballot through the bar code reader in their secure location, so it may be a few days after you've submitted your ballot.
