COVID-19 Related Information

COVID-19 Cases are Rising; Hospitalization Rates are Rising

Although the COVID-19 numbers are rising, I am glad to see most people in our area wearing masks and keeping a distance from others. Nevertheless, in the 20912 zip code alone, there have been 26 deaths due to COVID-19 and I have had requests for more public messaging about the need to wear masks and to be careful. We will expand our efforts in that and we ask that everyone helps. Even if you have had COVID-19 or are fortunate to get a vaccine in the coming months, please continue to wear a mask. We need the peer pressure, we need the normalization of these safety practices, to stave off more illness and death in our community.

COVID-19 testing in Takoma Park

It is good to get regularly tested for COVID-19, particularly about 4 days after a suspected exposure. Takoma Park has several sites for testing, two of which are free Montgomery Countyrun sites. In good weather, there is the drive-through or walk-up site behind Sligo Adventist Church on Greenwood Avenue near Flower and Carroll Avenues, that takes place on Wednesdays from 9 am to 4 pm. Starting this Saturday, there will be weekly testing inside the Takoma Park Recreation Center, 7315 New Hampshire Avenue, from 10 am to 5 pm.
