• Pothole Repairs Underway:

The City's on call contractor, NZI Construction, will be performing roadway repairs on several streets this week. The work areas include the following street sections:

- Maple Ave between Old Philadelphia and Philadelphia Ave, Hodges Lane at Chestnut Ave, 7400 block of Buffalo & 7300 block of Willow Ave, (Ward 1)
- Erie Ave at Flower Ave (Ward 5)
- Hancock Ave at Grant Ave & the 200 block of Lincoln Ave near Jefferson Ave (Ward 4)
- 1300 block of Holton Lane (Ward 6)

Additionally, repairs were completed by in-house staff in the 7500 block of Jackson Ave and 7000 block Aspen Ave (Ward 2) earlier this month.
