- The County Council held a work session yesterday on the Takoma Park Minor Master Plan to discuss the Planning Board draft and the recommendations of the Planning, Housing and Parks (PHP)Committee.

County staff presented the staff report, highlighting the recommendations of the Minor Master Plan report, community feedback, the County Executive's comments, and the PHP recommendations. Council members did not have any comments or objections during the presentation. Council members Jawando, Stewart, and Fani-Gonzalez made comments supportive of the plan at the end of the discussion. Council President, Andrew Friedson, concluded this agenda item by saying he looked forward to moving the Plan to a formal vote. This year, there are several new camp offerings for Takoma Park teens, both for Spring Break and Summer Vacation. For Spring Break, which will be March 25-29th, there are:

- <u>Filmmakers in Action</u> for grades 6-8. This camp focuses on the art of filmmaking and participants will have the opportunity to contribute to a docu-series about Takoma Park. Facilitated by Action Youth Media, this camp will be held in the Teen Lounge from 10am to 2pm each day. • We are pleased to let you know that the City of Takoma Park received another Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from GFOA. This is the sixth year that the City received the award.

This year, the City received outstanding scoring grades in two categories.

- 1. <u>Revenues</u>- The budget includes the revenue source, descriptions and analysis of major revenues. Revenues were enhanced with trend charts and the revenue discussion is very comprehensive.
- 2. <u>Long Range Financial Plans</u>- The financial forecast was presented with assumptions for the General Fund, capital and debt. The financial forecast section is detailed and informative.
