Police Department:

- On Friday, January 24th, Montgomery Parks suspended a portion of the Sligo Creek Open Parkway on Fridays moving forward. This is to alleviate traffic impacts at the intersection of Sligo Creek Parkway and Piney Branch Road, resulting from the Purple Line Construction. This is a temporary change.
- Together with the Takoma Park Volunteer Fire Department, we are plunging into the Chesapeake Bay with other law enforcement agencies on Friday, January 31st for the Polar Bear Plunge. - There is still space available in the 2025 Community Police Academy, which begins March 4th.

This free, 12-week program consists of one class a week on Tuesday evenings from 7:00 PM to 9:30 PM, covering patrol, traffic enforcement, use of force, criminal investigations, firearms, community policing, and more. The presentations are slide show/lecture style and will be presented by officers, detectives, and civilians of the Takoma Park Police Department. There will also be multiple opportunities for hands-on learning through equipment demonstrations, practical scenarios, field trips, and ride-a-longs with patrol officers.

If you are interested in learning about the Takoma Park Police Department and local government, if you are 16 years old or older and live or work in Takoma Park; then you may apply. The applicants will be accessing sensitive areas of the Police Department during the class. The applicants will be required to fill out a background check waiver to attend the class. The applicants may not have any serious misdemeanor or felony offenses.
