Information to Share

USDA Farmers Market Promotion Program Grant Awarded to Crossroads Community Food Network

Thanks in part to the City's support and partnership, we recently learned that the Crossroads Network has been awarded a <u>USDA Farmers Market Promotion Program</u> grant for \$250,000 over the next 3 years!

The project, "Building a Sustainable Farmers Market: Planning for Long-Term Food Access for Low-Income Crossroads Community Members," will help the Crossroad Network increase access to and consumption of local, fresh fruits and vegetables by expanding their nutrition education program at the market and by boosting market attendance and CSA participation; increasing market and CSA sales by diversifying their customer base; and helping more than 20 vendors, 75% of whom are socially disadvantaged themselves, build the capacity to expand their businesses into new markets.

LED Bus Tour – Monday, October 8th at 7:30pm

This Monday, Public Works is hosting an LED tour to demonstrate the LED streetlights that the City is piloting. During the tour, staff will share information about the lights and respond to resident's questions. If you are interested in attending, meet at the back lot of the Community Center shortly before 7:30pm. The tour, which will require some short distance walking, is expected to last about 90 minutes. In the event that residents would like to only participate in a portion of the tour, below is a tentative schedule:

- 7:35 pm: Buses leave Community Center, proceed down Flower Avenue from Piney Branch Rd to Erie Avenue, park on Erie Ave
- 7:45 8:05 pm: Brief walk around Erie and Flower Avenue to observe the two types of LED lights
- 8:05 to 8:10 pm: Drive to Elm Avenue near Hickory, park on Elm
- 8:15 8:45 pm: Walk up Hickory, to Columbia, turn on Columbia to Pine, turn down Pine to Montgomery, arrive back at Hickory and walk to buses on Elm
- 8:50 to 9 pm: Return to Community Center
