

Coffee with a Cop is a community-oriented event designed to foster better relationships between police officers and the communities they serve. The concept is simple: officers and community members come together in a relaxed, informal setting—usually at a local coffee shop or public space—to chat, ask questions, and share concerns.

The event has no set agenda or speeches, allowing for open, one-on-one interactions where people can discuss issues or simply get to know the officers serving their area. It helps build trust and understanding between law enforcement and the community by breaking down barriers and humanizing both sides.

It's often promoted as a way to make officers more approachable and to encourage transparent communication about safety, policing, and neighborhood issues. Many departments across the United States and beyond regularly host these events as part of their community engagement strategies.







**Mental Health Counselor** 

The City of Takoma Park collaborated with its first mental health counselor, appointed for a two-year pilot program aimed at delivering comprehensive mental health services to residents. She joined Takoma Park from the Montgomery County Crisis Center, where she excelled in providing mental health mobile outreach, petition evaluations, onscene support, Domestic Violence lethality screenings and referrals, grief support, and training.

Our counselor also serves as a Crisis Intervention Team instructor specializing in thought disorders, offering inservice training and consultation to enhance the community's response to mental health crises.

Before transitioning to social work, our liaison spent 17 years as a Police Officer. During her tenure, she worked in the human and sex trafficking units, engaged in negotiations, served as an investigation's liaison, and acted as a Field Training Officer. This diverse background in both law enforcement and mental health equips her with a unique skill set to effectively support the residents of Takoma Park. This pilot program is a collaboration between the City of Takoma Park and the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services, funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). It aims to implement and evaluate a counselor-only response system for mental health calls, moving away from traditional police-only or police and counselor models. An additional mental health counselor is expected to join the program in the coming months.


Rest Easy Good Boy







