## **Pavement Marking**

Bicycle pavement markings reinforce the legitimacy of bicycle traffic on the street. Motorists must share the road with cyclists, and show them courtesy and



Shared lane markings or "sharrows" communicate shared spaces for bike to all road users, and help direct cyclists at traffic circles and key turns along neighborhood bike routes.

Some streets in Takoma Park have striped shoulders marked for bikes. If space exists for a striped shoulde or bike lane on only one side of the road, it is usually placed in the climbing direction for slower moving



Contra-flow Bike Lanes are bike lanes designed to allow bicyclists to ride in the opposite direction of motor vehicle traffic. This is demonstrated on Grant Avenue in Takoma Park.

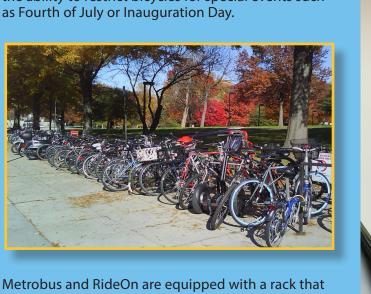
## **Bike Smart Bike and Transit** & Connected

Most Metro stations have bike racks and some have lockers available for rent, so you can ride your bicycle to a station, leave it there and take Metrorail or Metrobus. Bike & Ride facilities at some Metro stations provide inexpensive, yet secure bike parking with card access. This is a great option for those that live far from work.

Bicycles and folded bicycles are permitted on Metrorail during all operational hours on any car of any train, provided space is available. Metro reserves the ability to restrict bicycles for special events such
